- Resolution: Please ensure your artwork is at 300 DPI (dots per inch).
- Orientation: All submissions must be in a vertical orientation, corresponding to 26.5 inches by 39.5 inches.
- Format: We prefer high-resolution JPG or PNG files.
- **Creation:** the work should be an original piece, created by the submitter, without use of Generative AI for the creation of the submitted piece
- How to Submit: Please email your entries to lib.comm.marketing@colby.edu.
- Deadline: All submissions must be received by October 31st at 5:00 PM.

Winners, Display, and Inspiration for Years to Come!
