CYCLES A, B, C.

Part One: The Service of Light

All the lights in the church are put out and a fire is prepared.

Greeting and Introduction

Presider: Grace and peace from Jesus, the Christ, our brother and Savior be with you all.

All: And also with you.

Presider: My sisters and brothers in Christ, on this most holy night when our Savior Jesus, the Christ, passed from death to Life, we gather with the church throughout the world in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of Jesus, the Christ: Through light and the Word, through water and the bread and wine, we recall Christ's death and resurrection, we share Christ's triumph over sin and death, and with invincible hope we await Christ's coming again.

Deacon: Hear the word of God: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. In him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Blessing of the Fire

Presider: Let us pray. Eternal God, in Jesus, the Christ, you have given the light of life to the entire world. Sanctify this new fire, and inflame us with a desire to shine forth with the brightness of Christ's rising, until we feast at the banquet of eternal light; through Jesus, the Christ, the Sun of Righteousness.

All: Amen.

Presider: Make this new + fire holy, and inflame us with new hope. We ask this through Jesus the Christ, your Son, our brother and savior.

All: Amen.

Preparation of the Candle

1. Christ Yesterday and Today (trace vertical arm of the cross)
2. The beginning and the end (the horizontal arm)
3. Alpha (above the cross) A

Part Two: Liturgy of the Word

Prayer for Illumination

Deacon: Friends in Christ, let us listen attentively to the word of God, recalling God's saving deeds throughout history and how in the fullness of time, God's word became flesh and dwelt among us: Jesus the Christ, our Redeemer!

Through this Easter celebration, may God bring to perfection the saving work he has begun in us.

Please put out your candles at this time and be seated for the readings.

First Reading:

Genesis 1:1-2:2

The beginning of the book of Genesis.

In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless wasteland, and darkness covered the abyss, while a mighty wind swept over the waters.

Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. God then separated the light from the darkness. God called the light "day" and the darkness "night." Thus evening came, the morning followed - the first day.

Then God said, "Let there be a dome in the middle of the waters, to separate one body of water from the other." And so it happened: God made the dome, and it separated the water above the dome from the water below it. God called the dome "the sky." Evening came, and morning followed - the second day.

Then God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered into a single basin, so that the dry land may appear." And so it happened: the water under the sky was gathered into its basin, and the dry land appeared. God called the dry land "the earth" and the basin of the water "the sea." And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let the earth bring forth vegetation: every kind of plant that bears seed and every kind of fruit tree on earth that bears fruit with its seed in it." And so it happened: the earth brought forth every kind of plant that bears seed and every kind of fruit tree on earth that bears fruit with its seed in it.

And God saw that it was good. Evening came, and morning followed - the third day.

Then God said, "Let there be lights in the dome of the sky, to separate day from night. Let them mark the fixed times, the days and the years, and serve as luminaries in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth." And so it happened: God made the two great lights, the greater one to govern the day, and the lesser one to govern the night. Then, too, God made the stars, setting them in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth, to govern the day and the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. Evening came, and morning followed - the fourth day.

Then God said, "Let the water teem with an abundance of living creatures and on the earth let birds fly beneath the dome of the sky." And so it happened: God created the great sea monsters and all kinds of swimming creatures with which the water teems, and all kinds of winged birds. God saw that it was good and God blessed them and said, "Be fertile, multiply, and fill the water of the seas; and let the birds multiply on the earth." Evening came, and morning followed - the fifth day.

Then God said, "Let the earth bring forth all kinds of living creatures: cattle, creeping things, and wild animals of all kinds." And so it happened: God made all kinds of wild animals, all kinds of cattle, and all kinds of creeping things of the earth. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let us make humankind in Our image, after Our likeness.

Let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and the cattle, and over all the wild animals and all the creatures that crawl on the ground."

Humankind was created in God's image;
in the divine image God created them:
female and male God created them.

God blessed them and said, "Be fertile and multiply; fill the earth and be responsible for it. Have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and all the living things that move on the earth." God also said, "See, I give you every seed-bearing plant on the earth, and every tree that has seed-bearing fruit on it to be your food; and to all the animals of the land, all the birds of the air, and all the living creatures that crawl on the ground, I give all the green plants for food." And so it was. God looked at all of this creation, and proclaimed it good - very good. Evening came, and morning followed - the sixth day.

Thus, the heavens and the earth and all their array were completed. Since all the work was finished, God rested on the seventh day.

All: God, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.

Prayer

Presider: Let us pray: Almighty and eternal God, you created all things in wonderful beauty and order. Help us now to perceive how still more wonderful is the new creation, by which in the fullness of time you redeemed your people through the sacrifice of our Passover, Jesus, the Christ, who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **All: Amen.**

Second Reading:

Genesis 22:1-18

A reading from the book of Genesis.

It happened some time later that God put Abraham to the test. "Abraham!" God called. "Here I am," Abraham replied. "Take your son," God said, "your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you."

Rising early the next morning, Abraham saddled his donkey and took along two workers and his child Isaac. Abraham chopped wood for the burnt offering and started on the journey to the place God had pointed out. On the third day, Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance. Then Abraham said to the workers, "Stay here with the donkey. The boy and I will go over there; we will worship and come back to you."

Abraham took the wood for the burnt offering, loaded it on Isaac, and carried in his own hands the fire and the knife. Then the two of them set out together. "Look," Isaac said to Abraham, "here are the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?" Abraham answered, "My child, God will provide the lamb for the burnt offering." Then the two of them went on together.

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he tied up his child Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill the child.

But the angel of God called to him from heaven. "Abraham, Abraham!" the angel said. "I am here," he replied. "Do not raise your hand against the boy," the angel said. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not refuse me your son, your only child." Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham called the place "God provides," as it is said to this day: On the mountain God provides.

The angel of God called Abraham a second time from heaven. "I swear by my Self - it is God who speaks - because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only child, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants will possess the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth will find blessings - all this because you obeyed my command."

Presider: Let us pray. God and Father of all who believe in you, you promised Abraham that he would become the father of all nations, and through the death and resurrection of Christ you fulfill that promise: Everywhere throughout the world you increase your chosen people. May we respond to your call by joyfully accepting your invitation to the new life of grace. We ask this through Jesus, the Christ.

All: Amen.

Third Reading:

Exodus 14:15 -15:1

A reading from the book of Exodus.

Then Our God said to Moses, "Why are you crying out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. And you, lift up your staff and stretch out your hand over the sea, and split the sea in two, that the Israelites may pass through it on dry land. For my part, I will make the hearts of the Egyptians so hard that they will go in after them. Then I will receive glory at the expense of Pharaoh and all the army, chariots and charioteers. The Egyptians will know that I am the Most High God, when I receive glory through Pharaoh and the chariots and charioteers."

The angel of God, who had been leading Israel's camp, now moved and went around behind them. The column of clouds also, leaving the front, took up its place behind them, so that it came between the camp of the Egyptians and that of Israel. But the cloud now became dark, and thus the night passed without the rival camps coming any closer together all night long. Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and Our God swept the sea with a strong east wind throughout the night and so turned it into dry land. When the water was thus divided, the Israelites marched into the midst of the sea on dry land, with the water like a wall to their right and to their left.

The Egyptians followed in pursuit; all Pharaoh's horses and chariots and charioteers went after them right into the midst of the sea.

Just before dawn, Our God looked down upon the Egyptian forces from the column of fiery cloud, and threw the army into confusion and panic, clogging their chariot wheels that they could hardly drive. With that, the Egyptians sounded the retreat before the Israelites, because Our God was fighting for them against the Egyptians.

Then Our God told Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, that the water may flow back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots and their charioteers." So Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at dawn the sea flowed back to its normal depth. The Egyptians were fleeing head-on toward the sea, when Our God hurled them into its midst. As the water flowed back, it covered the chariots and the charioteers - Pharaoh's whole army - which had followed the Israelites into the sea. Not a single one of them escaped. But the Israelites had marched on dry land through the midst of the sea, with the water like a wall to their right and to their left. Thus, Our God saved Israel on that day from the power of the Egyptians. When Israel saw the Egyptians lying dead on the seashore and beheld the great power that Our God had shown against the Egyptians, the people held Our God in awe; they put their faith in Our God and in Moses, God's trusted servant.

Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to Our God:

"To you, Our God, I sing:
you have covered yourself in glory,
horse and rider you have thrown into the sea.
Our God is our strength and our song.
You have become our salvation."

Prayer

Presider: Let us pray. God of steadfast love, your wonderful deeds of old shine forth even in our own day. Through the waters of the sea, you once delivered your chosen people from slavery, a sign for us of the salvation of all nations through the grace of Baptism. Grant that all of the peoples of earth may be numbered among the offspring of Abraham, and rejoice in the inheritance of Israel: through Jesus, the Christ our brother and Savior.

All: Amen.

Fourth Reading:

Isaiah 54:5-14

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

For now Your Creator will be your spouse,
whose name is Our God Most High.
Your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel,
called the God of all the earth.
For Our God calls you back from your grief –
young wife abandoned by her husband.
I did abandon you for a brief moment,
but with much tenderness I will take you back.
In an outburst of wrath, I hid my face momentarily;
but with everlasting love I will gather you,
says Our God, Your Redeemer.
I am now as I was in the days of Noah
when I swore that Noah's waters
should never flood the earth again.

So now I swear not to be angry with you,
or to make threats against you.
For the mountains may disappear and the hills may depart,
but my love will never leave you
nor my covenant of peace be shaken,
says Your God, who has mercy on you.
O afflicted one, storm-battered and unconsolated,
I will lay your pavements in carnelians,
and your foundations in sapphires.
I will make your battlements of rubies,
your gates of crystal,
and all your walls of precious stones.
Your children will all be taught by Our God;
the prosperity of your children will be great.
In justice you will be established,
far from the fear of oppression,
where destruction cannot come near you.

Fifth Reading:

Isaiah 55:1-11

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

All you who are thirsty, come to the water!
You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat;
come, without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk!
Why spend your money for what is not bread,
your wages for what fails to satisfy?
Heed me, and you will eat well, you will delight in rich fare.
Bend your ear and come to me, listen, that you may have life.
I will make an everlasting covenant with you, the faithful mercies shown to
David. See, I have made of you a witness to the peoples,
a leader and commander of the nations.
See, you will summon a nation you never knew,
and a nation which does not know you will come hurrying to you -
for the sake of Your God, the Holy One of Israel,
who will glorify you.
Seek Your God while God is still to be found,
call to God, while God is still near.
Let the wicked abandon their ways,
the evil their thoughts.
Let them turn back to God, who will take pity on them,
to Our God, who will generously forgive.
For my thoughts are not your thoughts,
nor are your ways my ways, says Your God.

As high as the heavens are above the earth,
so high are my ways above your ways
and my thoughts above your thoughts.
For just as from the heavens
the rain and snow come down

Baruch 3:9-15, 32-44

A reading from the book of the prophet Baruch.

Listen, Israel, to commands that bring life;
hear, and learn what knowledge means.
Why, Israel, why are you in the country of your enemies,
growing older and older in an alien land,
sharing defilement with the dead,
reckoned with those who go to the nether world?
- Because you have forsaken
the fountain of Wisdom!
Had you walked in the way of God,
you would have lived in peace forever.
Learn where knowledge is,
where strength, where understanding,
and so learn where length of days is, where life,
where the light of the eyes and where peace.
But who has found out where she lives,
who has entered her treasure house?

Yet the One who knows all things knows her,
by the Creator's knowledge she has been embraced –
the One who established the earth for all time,
and filled it with four-footed beasts;
the One who dismisses the light, and it departs,
calls it, and it obeys, trembling;

Seventh Reading:

Ezekiel 36:16-28

A reading from the book of the prophet Ezekiel.

Thus the word of Our God came to me: When the house of Israel lived in their land, they defiled it by their conduct and deeds. Therefore, I poured out my fury upon them, because of the blood which they poured out on the ground, and because they defiled it with idols. I scattered them among the nations, dispersing them over foreign lands; according to their conduct and deeds I judged them. But when they came among the nations, wherever they came, they served to profane my holy Name, because it was said of them, "These are the people of Our God, yet they had to leave their land." So I have relented because of my holy Name which the house of Israel profaned among the nations where they came.

Therefore, I say to the house of Israel: Thus says Our God: Not for your sakes do I act, house of Israel, but for the sake of My holy Name which you profaned among the nations to which you came. I will prove the holiness of my great Name, profaned among the nations - for you are the ones who have profaned it.

Thus, the nations will know that I am the Most High," says Our Sovereign God, "because in their sight I prove my holiness through you. For I will take you away from among the nations, gather you from all the foreign lands, and bring you back to your own land. I will sprinkle clean water on you and cleanse you from all your impurities; I will cleanse you from all your idols. I will give you a new heart and place a new spirit within you; I will remove the heart of stone from your bodies and give you a heart of flesh.

I will put my Spirit within you and make you live by my statutes, careful to observe my decrees. You will live in the land I gave your ancestors; you will be my people, and I will be Your God."

All: Glory to God in whom we live and move and have our being; and peace to God's people on earth. O God, heavenly King, wonderful Creator, we worship You, we give You thanks, we praise You for Your glory.

Jesus the Christ, only Son of God; O God, Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world; have mercy on us. You are seated at the right hand of God; receive our prayer.

For You alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Most High, Jesus the Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God.

Amen.

Presider: God be with you.

All: And also with you.

Presider: Let us pray. Eternal Giver of life and light, this holy night shines with the radiance of the risen Christ. Romans 6:3-11

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans.

Do you not know that when we were baptized into Christ Jesus we were baptized in the death of Christ? We have been buried with Jesus through baptism, and we joined with Jesus in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by God's glory, we too might live a new life.

For if we have been united with Christ in the likeness of Christ's death, we will also be united with Christ in the likeness of Christ's resurrection. We must realize that our former selves have been crucified with Christ to destroy the sinful body and to free us from the slavery of sin: for when people die, they have finished with sin.

But we believe that having died with Christ, we will also live with Christ - knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, will never die again: death is now powerless over our Savior. When Christ died, Christ died to sin, once for all, so that this life now is life with God. In this way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Presider: Yours was the Spirit sweeping over the waters when the world first came to be, that water may give birth to life.

Presider: You made the flood an image of new birth, a new and better race of men and woman, a cradle of the holiness you ask.

Presider: Your people crossed the sea untouched and water was a sign of human freedom and a dedicated people.

Presider: Your Son was baptized by John in the Jordan to hear your words of love, words of brotherhood and sisterhood in one human family.

Presider: A cleansing flood of water and of blood flowed from his side, and then he charged us. “Make disciples of all nations, baptizing them...”

All: Blessed be God.

Presider: Look now upon your church with kindness and open up within it the fountain that will grace us with your Spirit, that those baptized may be born again.

All: Hear us, O God.

Presider: We pray O God, that the power of the Holy Spirit may be in this fountain and in our deed that those buried together with Christ Jesus in his death may rise together with him in new life.

All: Hear us, O God.

Presider: We ask this through Jesus, the Christ.

All: Amen.

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

Presider: My brothers and sisters:

On a people who lived in darkness and in deep shadow a great light has dawned. The light is the light of the Christ, a light that even the darkness of death could not overpower.

Presider: Those who lived in the darkness of ignorance and separation and who did not want to change opposed his light. However, it was welcome by all those who longed for truth, wholeness, and freedom.

Presider: We ourselves were in darkness once, but God our Father and Mother called us out of darkness into the wonderful light of the Christ. We must therefore try to live as children of the light. The effects of light are seen in goodness, right living and truth.

Presider: Now that we have successfully completed our Lenten exercises, and the light of Easter has dawned upon us, let us renew our belief in the light of Christ, our risen brother and Redeemer, and our determination to follow it faithfully. This, after all, is what we promised at Baptism when this light was first kindled in our hearts. Let us now reaffirm those baptismal promises.

Presider: Do you believe in God, our Creator, the one true God and source of all light?

All: We do.

Presider: Do you reject the many false gods the modern world offers for your adoration?

All: We do.

Presider: Do you reject the many false lights by which we are lured from the path of the Gospels: greed for material things, lust for pleasure, craving for popularity?

All: We do.

Presider: Do you believe in Christ, the light of the world?

All: We do.

Presider: Do you believe that the light of Christ shines within you and that you are called to let that light shine in the world today?

All: We do.

Presider: Do you promise then, that where the darkness of hatred reigns you will let the light of love shine?

All: We do.

Presider: That where the darkness of injury reigns you will let the light of pardon shine?

All: We do.

Presider: That where the darkness of doubt reigns you will let the light of faith shine?

All: We do.

Presider: That where the darkness of despair reigns you will let the light of hope shine? **All: We do.**

Presider: That where the darkness of falsehood reigns you will let the light of truth shine?

All: We do.

Presider: Do you believe that through his resurrection Jesus overcame the darkness of death and that we can do the same if we live in the nature of the Christ?

All: We do.

Presider: Do you believe in the holy catholic church, the community of believers in the light, brothers and sisters in Christ?

All: We do.

Presider: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit who dwells within us, to console us in times of sorrow, to strengthen us in times of difficulty, and to bind us together in the love of Christ?

All: We do.

Presider: And now, my sisters and brothers, I say to you in the name of the Christ, our risen Savior: hold up your heads. This is our faith. We are proud to profess it. Never be ashamed of this light. Carry it with pride and honor, with joy and love. If you do this, then Christ will not be ashamed of you before his Father in heaven. May God bless you and keep you faithful. But in your human weakness should you fail and fall back into the old ways of darkness, know that you can turn to the light at any time. The example of Jesus, the Christed One, will help you to walk in the light once more.

All: Amen.

Presider: Remember your Baptism and be thankful. In the name of God the Creator, the + Son and the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

PREPARATIONS

The Peace

Deacon: If you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember, your sister or brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first to be reconciled to your sister or brother, and then come and offer your gift. Since God has forgiven us in Christ, through his death, resurrection and the gift of baptism let us forgive one another.

Presider: The peace of Jesus the Christ be with you all.

All: And also with you.

Deacon: Let us share some sign of Christ's peace and forgiveness.

EPICLESIS

Presider: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the + body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit, make us one with Christ that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world.

COMMEMORATIONS

All: Remember, O God, your one holy catholic and apostolic church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

Remember your Bishops, priests, deacons, and all who minister in your church.

Remember all your people, and those who seek the truth.

Remember our parishioners who could not be with us tonight and our families and friends. **(Pause for silent reflection)**

Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ. **(Pause for silent reflection)** and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light.

And grant that we may find our inheritance with the blessed Virgin Mary, with the patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, Saint Margarite and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past.

CONCLUSION

Presider: Nourished at this table, O God, may we know Christ's redemptive love and live a new life in him. Help us who recognize the Christ in the breaking of the bread to see and serve him in all whose lives are broken. Give us who are fed at his hand, grace to share our bread with the hungry and with the hungry of heart. Keep us faithful in your service until Christ comes in final victory, and we shall feast with all your saints in the joy of your eternal realm because it is:

All: Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, eternal God, now and forever. Amen!
