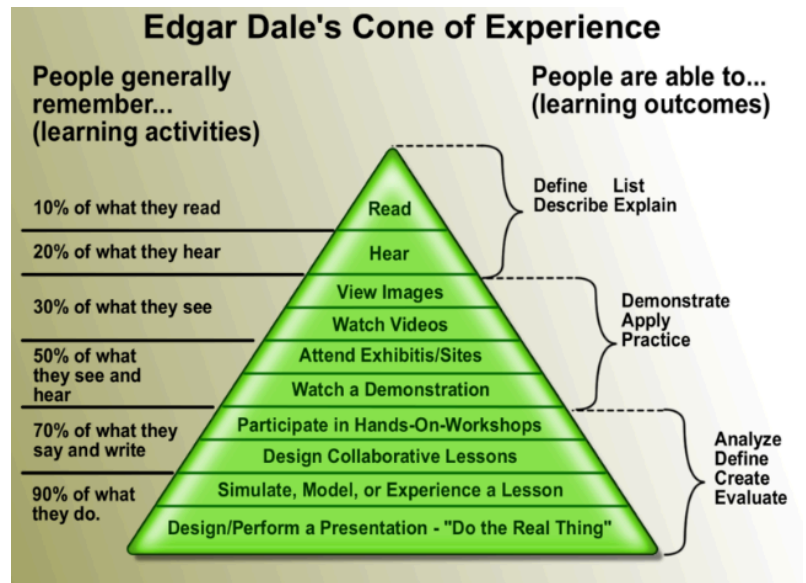
School and Classroom Expectations

- At Anna McKenney Intermediate School, we are **respectful, responsible, healthy, and scholarly.**

Classroom Behavior and Participation Expectations

- Learning is active, not passive. Students are expected to be on task and involved in their learning in my class. During some lessons/activities students have the option to volunteer their answers or ideas. However, there will be times where students are expected to contribute their answers, ideas, or participate by reading aloud.
- Students who are not making reasonable efforts to meet classroom and school site expectations for respectful, responsible, healthy, and scholarly behavior in class will face consequences that may include, but are not limited to, referrals, contact home, seat changes, or detention.

- In my classroom, there is a **ZERO TOLERANCE** policy for students showing disrespect (this applies to both people and objects), manipulative behavior, behavior that keeps me from teaching and/or prevents other students from learning, and behavior that jeopardizes safety. Everyone has a right to a free education in a safe environment; any student behavior interfering with that right will be met with consequences.



Literature

- In this class we focus on building reading comprehension, skills, strategies, and fluency using our Wonders curriculum and other supplemental resources.
- Students will work toward developing mastery of 6th grade California Common Core Reading Standards through completion of comprehension assignments and tests.

Math

- In this class, we will be working through daily review and math lessons using McGraw Hill Reveal Math and other supplemental resources to develop mastery of 6th grade California Common Core Standards.
- Students will work toward developing mastery of 6th grade California Common Core Math Standards through completion of assignments, quizzes, and tests.

Science

- In this class students will explore, and work toward developing mastery of, the 6th grade Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) using our California Elevate curriculum.
- Students will participate in this class through reading the text, taking notes, completing comprehension check assignments, completing lesson check assignments, and participating in hands-on activities.

Elective

- In this course, students will work to complete assignments that focus on basic computer programming and STEAM education. Examples of assignments may include using block coding to solve problems, watching an informational STEM video and completing a comprehension check, or solving simple STEAM challenges.
- Grading for this class will be based solely on assigned work. There will be no formal assessments for this class.

Grades

- It is vital for parents to monitor student grades using their own account in Aeries. ([Aeries Link](#)).
- Students will set up their Aeries accounts at school, and parents will be sent directions and codes that are needed. Directions are also available on my website ([Mrs. Greminger's Website](#)).

As per our district's policy students can only earn solid letter grades (No +/- grades)

Assignments, Tests and Quizzes:

Availability (All classes):

- A weekly planner is linked in the “Stream” of each of my Google Classrooms.
- All online assignments...
 - will be posted to Google Classroom at the start of the classes in which they are assigned.
 - will be due at the end of the period in which they were assigned (*unless otherwise stated in the assignment instructions in Google Classroom).
- Scores go into Aeries as soon as I can get them entered, and I will mark the assignment as “Done” for grading at that point. This allows students and parents to more easily see what work they are missing when checking Aeries.
- **More Time Accommodation:** Students needing more time (including extended time accommodations for IEPs as well as students who were absent on assignment day) will have 5 additional school days starting the day following the day the assignment posted to finish their work without penalty.
 - **Extended Time Grading:** Students should message me through Google Classrooms to let me know they are done late; I will get their score entered when I have a chance. If they do not message me, I will check back for scores on the 5th day. Anything completed after the 5th day will require a message from the student in order for a score to be recorded in Aeries (*See late work policy)
- Quizzes and tests are due at the end of the period in which they were assigned.
 - All quizzes in my math class are open-resource. This means students can use resources I have provided or shared. Quizzes are often password protected and may only be completed in class.
 - Revision or editing of quiz responses depends on the subject and platform used to administer the quiz. Whenever possible, I allow students to edit and revise during the period with which they were given to complete the quiz. I do not allow/accept edits or revisions once the period ends.
- All tests in my classes are CLOSED-resource. This means students can only use the knowledge in their brain to complete a test. Tests are often password protected and may only be completed in my classroom and under my supervision. Students cannot revise or edit their responses on tests.

Scoring:

- Most assignments as well as ALL tests/quizzes in my class will earn scores based on total available assignment points for each assignment/test/quiz (no weighted grading). If an assignment’s score is presented as a percentage, there will be points assigned by percent ranges (ex. 80-100% = 4 pts)
- All assignments (NOT tests or quizzes) are open-resource assignments; most have been set to allow students to view their score and edit their responses. Students can go back and edit their responses as long as they are utilizing their resources appropriately (textbooks, notes-taken during class, teacher created slides, teacher created videos, and/or videos embedded in the assignment).
 - **CAPPED SCORING IN SCIENCE:** Allowing students to edit responses is a privilege I choose to grant students. Due to the fact that there are students who choose to guess answers and not use their textbook and allowed resources for these assignments, they will be subject to the following policy.

Initial Score of...	Students will be able to edit their responses,...
51% or higher	and may earn up to 100%.
26-50%	but will earn no more than 75% of the total points for their final grade.
1-25%	but will earn no more than 50% of the total points for their final grade.
0%	but will earn no more than 25% of the total points for their final grade.

Cheating/Academic Dishonesty

- **One-of-a-kind assignments:** If a student is caught cheating by getting answers from another student, they will earn a score of zero for the assignment. The student also cheating by giving answers will lose the privilege for an edited score and will earn their initial score.
- **Assignments that are able to generate a different question set:** The student who was caught receiving answers will redo the assignment during lunch detention under my supervision. They will get ONE opportunity to make the assignment up during lunch. The student giving answers in these cases will lose the privilege for an edited score and will earn their initial score.

Make-up Work and Late Turn-In (past the 5 day extension):

- If a student is absent, they are expected to log-in to Google Classrooms and AERIES (as soon as they possibly can) to find out what lessons and assignments they have missed.
- In order to make up late work that has passed the 5 day extension, students can complete assignments any time. However, students MUST message Mrs. Greninger from the assignment in Google Classrooms for that assignment to let her know they have finished it.
- ALL "personal" absences, unexcused absences, tardies, or simple failure to get work done within the 5 day extension period that result in late assignment completion will earn up to, but no more than, 50% credit.
 - If a student has an incomplete assignment due to an absence accompanied by a doctor's note, they will be given a reasonable amount of time to complete the assignment for full credit. Missing work completed after the expiration of the reasonable time extension will earn up to, but no more than, half credit.
- Each quarter, Mrs. Greninger will communicate the final due date for late work submissions to all students well in advance of the actual final due date. Generally, the final date is the last Tuesday of the quarter.
- Students cannot make up tests or quizzes outside of the classroom. In order to make up a test/quiz, students need to message Mrs. Greninger (or email) to arrange for a date and time to come in at lunch and make up their test/quiz. Test and quiz scores will not be docked.
