Emergency Rankings

EMERGENCIES Call Now	URGENT Call or Text	LESS URGENT Call Daytime Phone
• Lost foster pet • Bites that break skin • Severe lethargy or non-responsive • Severe lacerations • Difficulty breathing • Cold to the touch • Seizures • Kittens/puppies under 5 weeks losing weight, not eating or having severe diarrhea • Broken bones • Sudden swelling • Injuries to eyes • Toxic plant or substance ingestion • Vomiting blood or repeated attempts to vomit unsuccessfully • Male cats straining to urinate or not producing urine.	• Severe/leaky diarrhea (over 5 weeks of age) • Vomiting more than twice • Not eating • Limping • Minor injuries (minimal bleeding)	• Congestion • Weepy or swollen eyes • Nasal discharge • Coughing • Hair loss • Skin lesions • "Happy tail" • Fleas • Internal parasites • Vomited once • Bloody stool • Mild diarrhea • Cats urinating outside the litter box.
