

INSTRUCTION FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

The abstract should contain:

Title: Bold, Arial, font size 11, capital letters (except for scientific names) and centered.

Author(s): Full name of authors, the name of the presenter for both oral and poster should be underlined in Arial font size 11 and centered. All authors' affiliations to be listed in the next paragraph in Arial font size 10 italic. If more than one institutions, list them numerically in the text. Provide email address of corresponding author in Arial font 10 italic. Single spacing between title and authors information.

Abstract to be written in American English. Length should not be more than 300 words. The left margin should be 40mm and the right, top and bottom margins should be 25mm. The text in abstract should be prepared in single spacing and justified using Arial font 11. The abstract should include introduction, objectives, results, discussion and conclusion. No figures and tables to be included in abstract. Abstract will be subjected to minimal editing, therefore, it is advisable for authors to proofread the text content prior to submission.

GUIDELINE FOR ORAL PRESENTATION

Softcopy of presentation should be submitted to the Scientific Committee (registration counter) during registration. For oral presentations, the time allocated is 10 min for presentation and 5 min for Q & A.

GUIDELINE FOR POSTER PRESENTATION

Posters should be presented in A1 (594 x 841 mm) size in **portrait** orientation.
