About MWEG

[Mormon Women for Ethical Government \(MWEG\)](#) is a nonpartisan, nonprofit faith-based community of women dedicated to civic empowerment and engagement. Our resources prepare our members with information, training, and opportunities to become more civically engaged and to participate meaningfully in shaping the world around them.

About the Role

As a volunteer videographer for the HER Arizona 250 campaign, you will play a key role in capturing the authentic voices of local communities across the Phoenix Metro and Tucson areas. In this role, you will head out into various public settings to conduct street interviews and facilitate pre-coordinated conversations with local individuals, using a provided microphone and standard mobile technology to gather high-quality video and audio recordings. You will work directly under the direction of the HER Arizona 250 team and maintain regular contact with the Arizona State Director to share public feedback, log interview metrics, and help refine our outreach strategy along the way. To thrive in this position, you should be an approachable, personable communicator who is comfortable speaking with diverse members of the public, adaptable to real-time feedback, and reliable in submitting your captured media on time. You will also need foundational tech skills to record audio and video, navigate email, and collaborate virtually with our broader team.

What You'll Do

- Conduct street interviews with the general public by asking provided questions, speaking clearly, and warmly engaging with diverse individuals.
- Capture high-quality video and audio recordings using a phone and provided microphone, then promptly submit the media to the HER Arizona 250 Team for editing and social media distribution.
- Maintain consistent communication with the Arizona State Director, reporting the total number of interviews conducted, sharing public feedback, and offering suggestions for adjustments to the interview process.
- Assist the HER Arizona 250 team with other project-related needs as they arise under the direction of campaign leadership.

What Makes You a Great Fit

- **Location:** Based locally in Arizona within either the Phoenix Metro or Tucson areas.
- **Communication & Interpersonal Skills:** Comfortable approaching and engaging with a wide variety of people, with demonstrated experience speaking to diverse audiences.
- **Technical Savvy:** Proficient with basic technology, including standard email usage, mobile video/audio recording, and a willingness to learn Basecamp for asynchronous team communication.
- **Growth Mindset:** Receptive to learning from public reactions and staff evaluations to continuously improve the interview process.
- **Reliability:** Punctual, dependable, and capable of submitting recorded media in a timely fashion so our editing team can keep up with publication schedules.
- **Committed Values:** Dedicated to operating in accordance with MWEG's core values, including the Principles of Ethical Government, inviolable practices and principles, and Principles of Peacemaking whenever representing the organization.

Schedule & Time Commitment

- **Time Commitment:** A minimum one-year commitment to working with MWEG is requested. The active HER Arizona 250 campaign runs from June through December, with potential opportunities to continue ongoing volunteer work afterward.
- **Daily Rhythm:** Highly flexible hours ranging from approximately 1–3 hours per week. Timely submission of video content is required to support the social media editing pipeline.
- **Training & Support:** Volunteers receive a thorough onboarding checklist to get acquainted with organizational values and tech tools. You will have direct access to mentorship, ongoing professional development, and leadership training designed to match your personal goals.

Things to Know

MWEG staff and volunteers are spread all over the country and rely on technological platforms to facilitate communication. They will be given access to an MWEG Google account, including Gmail and Drive, in addition to Basecamp, an asynchronous communication platform to collaborate virtually with their team. Regular video meetings will take place via Google Meet or Zoom, with an option to call in by phone if needed.

MWEG uses remote workplace software. All staff must attend training meetings the first week of their contract to learn how to use and communicate within the Basecamp collaborative platform. All staff provide their own work device(s) which must meet minimum standards of operating system security requirements.
