

Stages and Phrases

Stages are the steps you need to go through to “do” the can-do statement. For example, to give advice about social media usage, you usually hear what not to do.

Phrases are specific parts of the text you could repurpose by taking out the information specific to this text and adding in the information relevant to your own. For example, “Don’t publish news and rumors, don’t publish anything wrong” can be changed to “Don’t publish _____ and _____, don’t publish any _____.” Then you can fill in your own information.

- 1) Look at the transcript for a text and decide what stages are involved, such as an introduction, and listing information about each family member. List these stages and the numbered lines in the transcript associated with each stage.

Example:

Introducing Siblings: 5-6

- 2) For each numbered line in the transcript, take out the specific information and replace it with blanks.

Example:

لا تنشر أخبار وإشاعة، لا تنشر أي شيء غلط

Becomes:

لا تنشر _____ و _____ ، لا تنشر أي _____

- 3) Fill in the blanks with your own information.

Example:

لا تنشر خبر سيءٍ وحتى خبر جيدٍ ، لا تنشر أي صور أصحابك
