Methodology

Research materials; procedures and study design; description of how the study was conducted; research question; hypothesis (if applicable); stages of the study; methods applied; measures ensuring the reliability of the results.

Results and discussion

Main findings of the study; analysis and interpretation of the results; comparison with previous research; critical discussion; conclusions based on the obtained results.

Conclusion

General summary of the study; confirmation of the validity of the author's thesis; final conclusions based on the results obtained; implications for the development of scientific knowledge; prospects for further research; possibilities for practical implementation and application.

Funding

Information about financial support of the research (if applicable), including the name of the funding organization and grant number. If there was no external funding, this section may be omitted.

Conflicts of Interest

Disclosure of any financial, personal, or professional relationships that could be perceived as influencing the research. If there are no conflicts, state: **The authors declare no conflict of interest.**

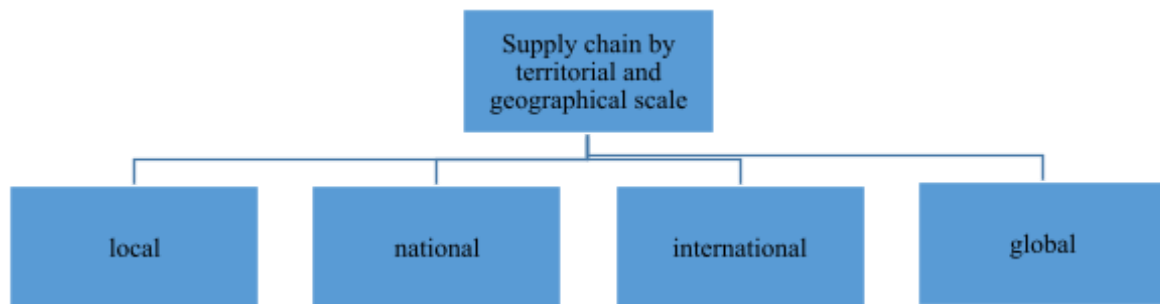

Romanized References

Author(s) (transliteration) → (Year in parentheses) → Title of the article in transliteration [English translation of the title in square brackets] → Title of the source in transliteration (or official English title, if available) → Publication details in English.
