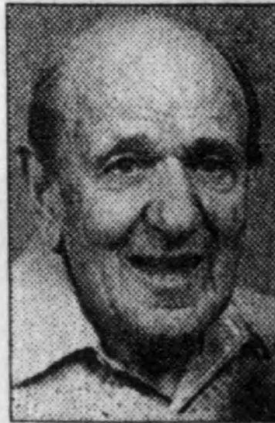

Frank L. Miller, 82, Green Bay, died Tuesday, Jan. 26, 1999, at a local nursing home. He was born Oct. 31, 1916, in Oshkosh to the late Louis and Leona Miller. Frank served his country during World War II, from 1941 to 1945, in the United States Army. On Sept. 21, 1946, he married Marie Anna Gessert. Frank had been employed by the U.S. Postal Service from 1946 until his retirement in 1980. He had been a member of St. Jude Parish and was a life-long Chicago Cubs fan.

OSHKOSH SOLDIER INJURED AT CAMP WHEN TRUCK TIPS

**Sgt. Frank Miller Suffers
Brain Concussion in Mis-
hap at Camp Living-
ston, Louisiana**

Sgt. Frank Miller, 25, Oshkosh, was seriously injured Wednesday of this week, at Camp Livingston, La., when the army truck in which he was riding tipped over in maneuvers.

According to messages received by his mother, Mrs. Leona Miller, 845 Seventh street, he suffered a brain concussion, and was unconscious for several hours after the accident. He also sustained a broken collarbone.

Sergeant Miller was among the first Oshkosh men to go to Camp Livingston. He left here more than a year ago as a member of the national guard unit, 127th infantry.

Before going south with the army, he was employed by the Castle-Pierce Printing Company.

Sgt. Frank L. Miller, 845 Seventh street, was with the 48th armored infantry battalion. He served in the battles of northern France, Ardennes, the Rhineland and central Europe. His decorations include the American defense ribbon, the European-African theater ribbon with four bronze battle stars and three overseas bars as well as the good conduct medal and one service stripe.

Sgt. Frank L. Miller has been placed on detached service with Headquarters, Camp Livingston, La., and will be with that organization until further orders. According to the latest news from Camp Livingston, Sergeant Miller, who recently sustained injuries in an auto accident, has been reported as doing nicely.
