
Scholarship Sites-

Each scholarship will have different criteria and **deadlines**. Take a look and see what is out there! Below is just a handful of what is out there. Some students prefer one site over another. Always use your best judgement and never pay for a scholarship!

- **WashBoard.org**. Unlike other web-based scholarship searching tools, the goal of theWashboard.org is to connect students with available local and state scholarships. TheWashBoard.org is free to use. They do not use spam, marketing ads or pop-up advertisements on the site.
- **Raise Me**; Starting as early as 9th grade, students can start a Raise Me account and start collecting micro-scholarships. Over 200 colleges nationwide participate in Raise Me. Students can earn scholarships for grades, school leadership, PSAT and more.
- **Going Merry**. Scholarship search tool. Bundled scholarships. Can apply directly onsite. Can filter, favorite scholarships. No advertisements.
- **BigFuture Scholarship Search** is part of College Board. Students enter as much information as possible to find the best matches. <https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/scholarship-search>
- **Fastweb scholarship** search a large scholarship database. If you supply an email address, they will notify you when new awards that match your profile are added to the database. <http://www.finaid.org/>

- **Niche.com**: On Niche.com, students can gain a sense of each school's "personality," Hartley says, by reading student reviews. They can also search for scholarships. Niche pairs students with the scholarships that match their qualifications, with student-friendly categories like no-essay scholarships. www.niche.com
