

PUBLIC HEARING was held on Monday, March 22, 2004, at 6:45 p.m. in the Council Chambers at 82 Main St., Hornell, N.Y.

PURPOSE of the public hearing was to hear impact and comment on the City of Hornell's 2004 application to the Small Cities grant program. It was the second public hearing on the matter.
