The introduction should be clear and provide the issue to be discussed in the manuscript. Before the objective, authors should provide an adequate background, and very short literature survey in order to record the existing solutions/method, to show which is the best of previous researches, to show the main limitation of the previous researches, to

show what do you hope to achieve (to solve the limitation), and to show the scientific merit or novelties of the paper.¹

At the end of the paragraph, the author/s should end with a comment on the significance concerning identification of the issue and objective of the research.²

The introduction should contain a brief description of the literature (maximum of 10 references) that already exists on the same topic and shows what is the difference (state of the art) with the writing to be made, at least 10% of the total number of words throughout the writing.
