

Here is a review of Google search commands:

**intitle:** tells Google that the word must appear in the **title** of all the websites Google finds. There should be no gap between the command and the word or phrase you are looking for e.g. **intitle:snow**

**allintitle:** This command tells Google that **all the words you search for must appear in the title of all the websites** Google finds. There can be spaces between this command and the words you type in (in fact if you're looking for more than one word there HAS to be spaces ... Why?).

**"January"** **Quotes** tell Google that the word **must appear somewhere** in each of the websites Google finds.

**"New Year"** **Quotes** also tell Google that the two words must appear together, in this order, as if they were glued together, in every one of the websites Google finds.

**-February** The **minus sign** tells Google that the word must **NOT** appear in any of the websites Google finds. There should be no gap between the minus sign and the word you're looking for.

**March** If no parentheses, no minus sign, or no other Google command is used Google **might ... or might not ...** find webpages that contain the word **March**.

**site:edu** Google only looks for **university or college websites** (you can use either `site:edu` or `site:.edu`)

**site:gov** Google only looks for websites created by the **U.S. Government** (you can use either `site:gov` or `site:.gov`)

**Important! All Google commands must be lower case.**

use `intitle:` don't use `Intitle:` and don't use `INTITLE:`

Some examples:

intitle:"New England" intitle:playoffs "football" January -statistics

The phrase **New England** must be in the title (glued together) and the word **playoffs** must also be in the title. The word **football** must be somewhere in the website, the word **January** might or might not show up in the website, and the word **statistics** must not appear.

"totalitarian states" intitle:"Dark Web" privacy -"North Korea"

The phrase **totalitarian states** must appear somewhere in the website (glued together), the phrase **Dark Web** must appear in the title (glued together), the word **privacy** might or might not show up in the website, and the phrase **North Korea** must not appear in the website.

allintitle: "smoky mountains" "north carolina" hiking

The phrase **Smoky Mountains** must appear in the title (glued together), the phrase **North Carolina** must appear in the title (glued together), and the word **hiking** must also appear in the title. Question - why don't we need quotes around the word **hiking**?

**Important! Google searches that use allintitle: can not also include the minus sign ... nor can they include the command site: (e.g. site:.edu). Question - why not?**

intitle:"World Trade Organization" "globalization" "currency" policy -bitcoins site:.gov

This search looks for **government websites** that must contain the phrase **World Trade Organization** in the title, and must contain the words **globalization** and **currency** somewhere in the website. The word **policy** might or might not appear in the website and **bitcoins** must **not** appear.

site:.edu "sock puppet" -Macedonia "fake news"

This search looks for **university websites** that must contain the phrases **sock puppet** and **fake news** and must not contain the word **Macedonia**.
