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Studying Abroad

- One elective towards the minor may be taken abroad upon approval from the Curriculum Committee. No more than one course taken abroad can be applied toward the minor.
- Ordinarily, credit will only be granted on returning from the program, on evaluation of the syllabus and graded work completed in the course.
- In order for a course taken abroad to be considered for MHHC minor credit, it should be consistent with the Medical Humanities as the interdisciplinary, humanistic, and cultural study of illness, health, health care, and the body. Consideration requires an application and approval by the Medical Humanities Program.
- To submit a course for approval, submit the following materials to medical.humanities@bc.edu: course syllabus, a brief description of the course, work that fulfilled a representative assignment (i.e. your paper that constituted the largest part of your grade).
- Several three-week courses offered through the Office of International Programs count towards elective credit in the minor. See the [OIP Website](#) for more information.
- One elective from an OIP-approved program can be counted towards the minor.
- Courses must be taken in a program approved by the Office of International Programs. Courses should not be substantially similar to a course that the student has already taken at Boston College.
