# Get REAL: Validating Information on the Web

### **R = READ the URL** (The URL is another term for web address.)

## Do you recognize the domain name?

Example: www.yourschool.org Domain name: yourschool

Extension: .org

### What is the extension in the domain name?

**Common Extensions** 

- **k12** Schools in the United States
- edu Educational Organizations (most colleges and universities)
- com Commercial
- org Any organization
- gov United States Government
- **net** Network
- mil United States Military Institutions

## Are you on a personal page?

Clues that it's a personal page

- You don't recognize the domain name
- A name (such as cervin)
- Tilde (~)
- Percent Sign (%)
- The words users, people, or members

## What happens when you truncate the address?

Delete everything in the address after the domain. What can you tell about the site from the home page?

### **E = EXAMINE the Content**

- Is the information on the web site useful for your topic?
- Are additional resources and links provided? Do they work?
- Is the site current? Do you know when it was last updated?
- Do you think the information is accurate?
- Does the information contradict information you have found elsewhere?

### A = ASK about the Author/Owner

- Is the author's name provided?
- Is there a contact person or an address provided?
- Is there biographical information provided about the author?
- Does the author seem knowledgeable? Is he/she an expert in the field?
- What kinds of results do you see when you do a search on the author's name?

This site collects information from the internet to track who owns and is responsible for a domain name.

The Way Back Machine

This site allows you to browse web pages archived from 1996 to recently.

#### L = LOOK at the Links

When your cursor hovers over a link, the cursor will change from a pointer to a hand and the URL will appear in the bottom left hand corner of the web page.

- What are the URL's of the links?
- Do the domain names change?
- What do other sites say about the material on the site?
