Subject: Request Approval for Emergency Contract – Click to enter requested service.

Per the State Contracting Manual (SCM), Volume I, Section 3.10, Emergency Contracts (Rev 11/12):

Emergency is defined in PCC § 1102 as “a sudden, unexpected occurrence that poses a clear and imminent danger, requiring immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss or impairment of life, health, property, or essential public services.” To qualify as an emergency, a contract must meet all elements of this statutory definition.

Emergency contracts are exempt from advertising and competitive bidding, and do not require an NCB.

Ordinarily, services contracts should not be commenced before formal approval by DGS/OLS if dollar amounts require DGS/OLS approval. However, in emergency circumstances an award may be made with the approval of the agency head or their designee without DGS/OLS approval. Thereafter, the contract should be sent to DGS/OLS for approval. Other required approvals may be deferred in the same manner.

Based on the State Contracting Manual and Public Contracting Codes cited above, I am requesting your review of this justification for the emergency below in order to receive approval prior to obtaining the services.

UNARMED SECURITY GUARD SERVICES - Security services required to restrict public access to an active timber harvest operation that includes timber falling and heavy equipment operation on the State Forest. Restricting access is needed for the safety of the public and safety of the Licensed Timber Operator employees and workers. Service needed is 3 guards per day, 7 days a week, from June 07, 2021 thru October 15, 2021. Estimated total cost is \$960,120.00
