## Connection/Hook

### Whole Groups: Let's Play a **Game!**

- Give every student a sticky note.
- Review: What's a noun?
- Have each student write a random noun on the sticky note.
- Each student should stick their note on the board.
- Randomly pull two sticky notes.
- Make a list of the things they have in common.
  - Example: CAT & COMPUTER
    - both start with the letter C
    - both have a T in them
    - both need electricity to operate
    - people purchase both
    - both can be broken
    - both can give the owner pleasure
    - both can die
    - both hate water
    - you can donate both to charity
    - both can be purchased at a store
    - etc
- Make this a competition the next time. Create partners or groups. Choose two more nouns. Use <u>THIS WORKSHEET</u> for the practice. When the timer starts (3 minutes), the team should create a list of all the similarities of the words.
