



Graduate Student Award 2026

DESCRIPTION: The Middle Level Education Research Special Interest Group is comprised of leading middle-level researchers both nationally and internationally. This Graduate Student Award is intended to promote and recognize outstanding research in the field of middle-level education and is presented annually to a graduate student or recent graduate of a masters, specialist, or doctoral program.

ELIGIBILITY: Any person who has graduated between July 1, 2024 and December 31, 2025 may apply. The focus of the research **MUST** be on a topic of relevance to middle level education.

CRITERIA: In addition to the application form linked below, please submit an abstract of your research for blind review. All submissions, regardless of level (master's, specialist, doctoral), will be evaluated using the same criteria. Your abstract is limited to five pages (double-spaced, one-inch margins, size 12 Times Roman Font). The abstract should address the following areas:

- (1) Research question(s) or hypothesis(es)
- (2) Significance of study to the field of middle level education
- (3) Research design
- (4) Findings
- (5) Conclusions and implications for practice
- (6) References
