## Synchronous- (approximately 60 minutes total per day)

learning that occurs at the same time, but not in the same place. During synchronous instruction, students learn from their teacher or peers in *real-time*. Aside from Morning Announcements, this type of instruction will generally be delivered in 15-20 minute segments with small groups of students. *There are no regularly scheduled afternoon synchronous sessions*.

**Asynchronous-** learning that occurs not only in different locations but also at *different times*. During asynchronous instruction, students learn by watching pre-recorded video lessons, email/chat exchanges between teachers and students, online discussion boards, completion of independent practice assignments, etc. Teachers will use SeeSaw (K-1) and Google Classroom (2-8) to organize and manage asynchronous learning.
