

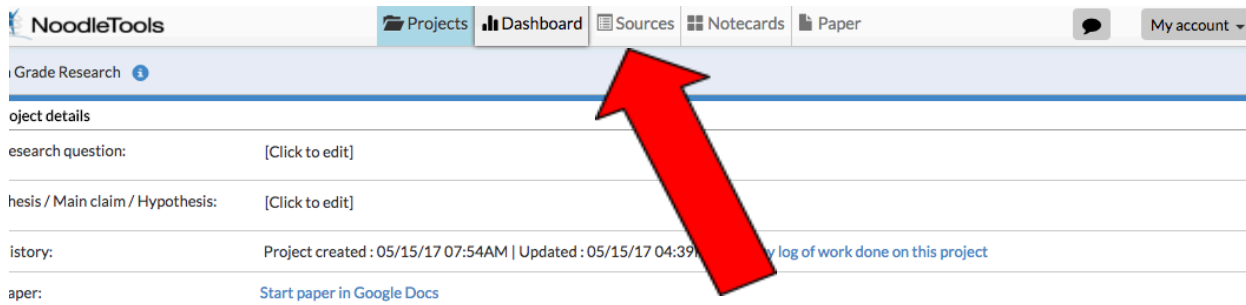

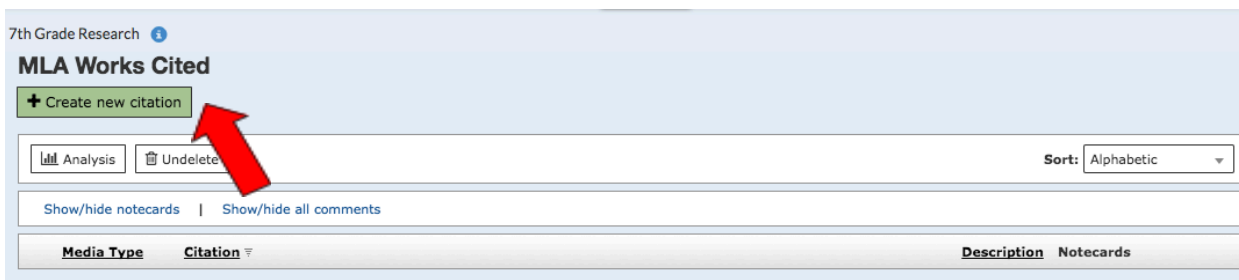

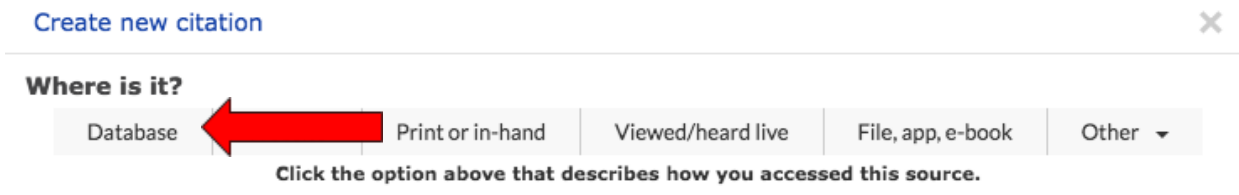
- Login to NoodleTools
- To create citation click on the SOURCES tab.



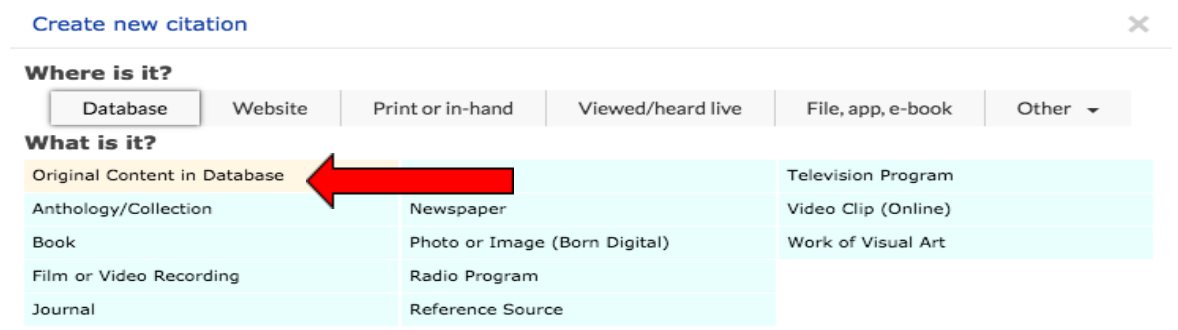
- Click Create new citation




- Choose DATABASE



- Choose ORIGINAL CONTENT in Database




- Click on “COPY & PASTE A CITATION”
