Dual Enrollment Opportunities for WJ Students

Virtual Middle College Eligible students apply in Gr. 9 by the published fall deadline. This is a free degree pathway in which students graduate with a high school diploma and an associate degree while taking MC classes online.

Early College Eligible students apply in Gr. 10 by the published fall deadline. This is a free degree pathway in which students graduate with a high school diploma and an associate degree while attending college classes on one of the MC campuses during Grades 11 & 12. *Early College students are assisted by their WJ counselors, not the DEPA.*

Jumpstart to College Students in Gr. 9-12 who meet all eligibility requirements may take individual courses and earn from 3-60 college credits; this is not a designated degree pathway. Students may take up to two approved MC courses for free each fall and each spring semester; the cost of additional courses is the responsibility of the student. A need-based MC High School Grant is available for winter and summer courses. Students have the option to drop one or two high school classes for each MC class and abbreviate their WJ schedules, with permission from their parents/guardians, counselors, and grade administrators. Classes may be taken online or in-person on an MC campus or at WJHS. **Explore the links listed below for more *Jumpstart to College* information.**

Jumpstart to College Quick Facts:

- Students who start the registration process when the registration window opens have the best chance of securing seats in their preferred classes!

- MC Fall registration opens in April; students should submit course registration requests by Memorial Day. Spring registration opens in October; students should try to submit course requests before Thanksgiving.
- Each participant must apply to MC as Dual Enrollment student, receive an M#, meet eligibility requirements, and set up required accounts before registering for classes.
- ALL students must show college readiness in English and may need to show readiness or mastery in other subjects, depending on course selection.
- Students request classes via a *dualenroll* registration account - NOT on the MC site.
- MC's Dual Enrollment Office is responsible for officially registering students in classes once all requirements have been satisfied.
- Dual credit is an option that students must accept or refuse during course registration.
- Students with 504 Plans or IEPs work with MC's Disability Support Services to request accommodations.
