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Campus Budget

CSUSB is facing an \$18 million deficit for the 2025-2026 academic year, compounding ongoing budget challenges that have already led to hiring freezes, reductions in reassigned time, reductions in travel support, layoffs of MPPs, and increased course caps. Additionally, staff reductions have increased strain on our ability to recruit, enroll, and serve our students. To address faculty concerns and advocate for budget transparency, the Faculty Senate has taken the following actions:

- EC Members hosted college-level open forums to solicit feedback, Fall 2024
- Chair Jordan Fullam submitted a [letter to administration requesting budget transparency](#) based on faculty feedback, 1/30/25
- Chair Jordan Fullam requested the President host an additional campus open forum to respond to faculty concerns, [2/4/25](#)
- Faculty Senate adopted [Resolution in Support of Using Reserves to Mitigate Layoffs and Increased Workloads at CSU Campuses](#), 2/4/25
- Chair Jordan Fullam is serving on the Enrollment Management Council to represent faculty
- EC members requested funding from the President to support a new Senate Legislative Liaison position to engage in lobbying and legislative action on the budget and other important issues
- EC members attended UBAC meeting on 2/28/25 and requested development of 3-year plan to proactively address projected deficits
- EC members requested college-level open forums hosted by administrators and EC members to facilitate consultation with faculty

ChatGPT Edu

CSU has agreed to pay \$16.9 million to OpenAI for access to ChatGPT Edu. The ASCSU was not consulted on the contract. While faculty have different views on the use of AI in our work, faculty on our campus have voiced concerns about the cost of ChatGPT Edu given a constrained budget, ethical considerations, intellectual property rights, lack of policy guidance and preparation, and lack of consultation. To address these concerns:

- Vice Chair Zachary Powell is serving on CSUSB's ChatGPT Edu Steering Committee to represent faculty
- Revised [FAM 803.5 Academic Dishonesty](#) including new section on generative AI
- EPRC Chair John Rietzel and FAC Chair Mark Groen requested that the committees make recommendations on additional FAM revisions

Threats to DEI

Federal threats to diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) in higher education have intensified with the U.S. Department of Education's release of the "Dear Colleagues" letter. These efforts seek to restrict DEI initiatives, dismantle civil rights protections won through decades of political struggle, and suppress academic freedom. Preemptively complying with these unconstitutional and un-American demands risks dismantling support systems for historically-excluded students and undermining our core values as an institution. The Faculty Senate has an obligation to uphold these values and lead efforts to protect them. To ensure that faculty have a strong voice in shaping our campus's response, a subcommittee of the EC will develop recommendations and present them to the Faculty Senate on 4/8/25.

Looking Ahead

We have made considerable progress in fostering trust, collaboration, and respect in the Faculty Senate. Yet, there are still significant challenges ahead. As I emphasized at the start of the academic year, I believe that shared governance must include meaningful democratic control of decision-making that shapes the academic mission of CSUSB. There is more work to be done to advance faculty rights and ensure that shared governance is substantive and not merely performative. We are facing unprecedented challenges that could fundamentally reshape our institution. However, we are in a strong position to advance our shared values and ensure that faculty have a strong voice in shaping the path forward.
