**Task 2: How Much, How Many, and A Lot**

Complete the questions with HOW MUCH or HOW MANY and the answers with NOT MUCH, NOT MANY, or A LOT.

1. **How many** cookies do you prepare in a week?
  - a. **A lot** . We bake for everyone at work. We bake a few dozen each week.
2. **How much** time does it take to bake that cake?
  - a. **Not much** Only about an hour and a half, including the baking time.
3. **How many** different kinds of cupcakes do they offer?
  - a. **Not many** There are only two or three choices.
4. **How much** do they spend on ice cream each week?
  - a. **Not much** They only eat ice cream when friends come over.
5. **How much** sugar do you use in your muffins?
  - a. **Not much**. I don't like muffins that are too sweet.
6. **How many** eggs did you buy?
  - a. **A lot**. Three dozen. I use eggs when I cook, and we all eat eggs for breakfast.
7. **How many** people did you invite?
  - a. **A lot**. I invited all my friends and relatives, and I have many friends and a big family.

**Task 3: A Few / A Little / Too Few / Too Little**

The words "a few" and "a little" refer to a small quantity. If you say "too few" or "too little" it means not a sufficient quantity.

1. What do we need to make the cake?
  - a. **A few** eggs and **a little** cheese.
2. Why didn't you make the tortillas?
  - a. We had **too little** masa.
3. Why did they cancel the course?
  - a. **Too few** students registered for it.
4. Who came to the party?
  - a. **A few** of my best friends.
5. Make sure you add **a little** oil to the pan (sarten) before you cook the tortillas.
6. My plants are brown. There is **too little** rain these days.
