HB 4092A PASSED: Creation of a state e-rate fund for libraries

The Oregon legislature recently **voted to approve HB 4092A** and establish the Connecting Oregon Libraries Fund!

#### Thank your legislator for voting to support Oregon libraries

The Connecting Oregon Libraries Fund maximizes broadband funding for libraries from the FCC's E-Rate program and establishes an Oregon E-Rate fund to provide additional funding to help libraries move forward on critically needed broadband infrastructure projects. Establishing a state E-Rate fund in Oregon is also the first step to securing up to 10% in extra Federal funds for projects that meet certain criteria.
