
Abstract consists of 150-250 words written in one paragraph, followed by keywords. Abstract contains writing background, purpose of writing, discussion, and conclusion. If it is the result of research, it must contain the methods and results of the study. Abstracts and keywords are written in two languages, namely in Indonesian and English. (TNR, 11pt, single line spacing, 1 paragraph)

Introduction (TNR, 12pt, bold)

Manuscripts should be written on A4 size paper with the following margins: 4 cm (top), 3 cm (right), 3 cm (bottom), and 4 cm (left). The manuscript's length, including tables and illustrations, should be between 10-20 pages or 4,000-8,000 words. Paragraphs are 1,5 spaced with full justification and they begin with a left indent

The introduction should explain the general background and research question or hypothesis. If there is literature review, it can be included in this chapter. The study objective should be written at the end of the introduction.

Methods

The research methods should elaborate on the method utilized in addressing the issues including the method of analysis. It should contain enough details allowing the reader to evaluate the appropriateness of methods as well as the reliability and validity of findings.

Result and Discussion

The research result and discussion section contain results of the research findings. The findings acquired from the results of the conducted research should be written with the supplementary support of adequate data. The research results and findings should be able to resolve or provide explanations to the question stated in the introduction.

Conclusion

The concluding statement should contain summary and suggestion. The summary should exemplify the answers provided to the hypothesis and/or research objectives or acquired findings. The summary should not contain repetition of research results and discussions, and it should instead contain a summation of research results and findings as expected in the research objective or hypothesis. The suggestions should present matters that will subsequently be conducted in relation to the research's ensuing concepts.
