YEAR 1 - 9TH GRADE

Fall

- ☐ Make sure you are connected to your Active Student account.
- ☐ Get a good start with your grades; the courses with credits beginning in 7th grade are included in your final high school GPA/QPA which is sent to colleges, the military, and employers.
- ☐ Join extracurricular activities, both school and non-school-sponsored

Spring

- ☐ Meet with your counselor to select appropriate challenging courses for 10th grade.
- Explore your interests and possible careers with your school counselor.
- ☐ Investigate and join summer enrichment programs, community service, and other volunteer activities.

YEAR 2 - 10TH GRADE

Fall

- ☐ Make sure you are connected to your Active Student account. Check your GPA/QPA, and meet with your counselor if needed.
- ☐ Continue to keep your grades high so that your GPA/QPA reflects your abilities.
- ☐ Continue to be involved in extracurricular activities
- ☐ If you are interested in attending one of the military universities, begin your application process now.

Spring

- ☐ Meet with your counselor to select appropriate challenging courses for 11th grade.
- Continue to explore your interests and possible careers with your school counselor
- Begin to research the three E's (Enroll-colleges, Enlist-military, or Employee-career).
- ☐ Investigate and join summer enrichment programs, community service, and other volunteer activities.

YEAR 3 - 11TH GRADE

Fall

- ☐ Make sure you are connected to your Active Student account. Check your GPA/QPA, and meet with your counselor if needed.
- Continue to keep your grades high so that your GPA/QPA reflects your abilities.

- ☐ Continue to explore the three E's and begin to narrow down your interests.

		Apply to all colleges or Trade Schools of interest as early as possible.
