Abstract

The abstract should be written in English with a length of 150–250 words and serves to provide an overview of the research or community engagement activities conducted. It should include a brief background and the primary objective or hypothesis of the study, presented concisely in 1–2 sentences, and describe the main procedures used in the study, including the selection of subjects or partners, data collection techniques, observation methods, and analytical approaches applied. The abstract should also present the main findings, particularly the outcomes related to the implementation of community engagement, summarizing key results, including effect sizes and statistical significance, where applicable. The final part of the abstract should state the principal conclusions, highlighting the novel contributions and important findings derived from the study of community engagement. The abstract must be accompanied by at least five keywords that represent the core concepts of the article, such as theoretical foundations, research methods, study location, or general themes of community development.

1. INTRODUCTION

Research articles and theoretical articles should be between 6000 and 9000 words long. For review articles, the length of the manuscript is recommended between 5000 to 6000 words, while case-based articles (including Technical Articles and Policy/Practice Articles) should range from 4000 to 5000 words. The manuscript must be written in American English, and any terms from other languages must be explained along with an appropriate English translation.

The manuscript must be submitted in Microsoft Word (docx) format typed with 1.5 spaces, using portrait-oriented A4 paper, right and left aligned, and without special formatting. The author is responsible for ensuring that the manuscript does not contain information that could identify the author, except on the Title Page (see separate template).

The Introduction section at least contains: (1) the background of the research, namely an explanation of the phenomenon or problem that is the focus of the study; (2) the urgency of research, which explains the importance of research and its benefits for the development of science and practical problem solving; (3) review of previous research, to show the progress of existing studies; (4) research gap, which is a gap or limitation of previous research that has not been answered; (5) novelty, which describes the new contribution that research offers; and (6) the objectives and contributions of the research, which explain the specifics of the objectives to be achieved and the expected benefits of the research results. Thus, the introduction not only provides the context of the research, but also shows the scientific reasons why the research is important to conduct.

2. METHODS

In this section, the author should explain the approach used to solve the problem and achieve the research objectives. Describe the techniques used to collect the data, including how to select the sample, the validity, and the reliability of the tools used. In addition, also mention data analysis techniques, the location of the activity, the time, and the duration of the implementation. The author also needs to describe the initial conditions before the program starts and the expected results of its implementation.

Methods should be presented in the form of narratives, not bullet points, so that the description of the methodology is easier to understand and well-structured. Each abbreviation used should be explained the first time it appears and used consistently throughout the article. If the author is referring to a previously published method, it is recommended to include the reference and explain in detail if there are any changes or adjustments to the method.

3. RESULTS

In this section, the findings of the research are presented objectively and clearly structured. Each result obtained must be presented in detail, whether in the form of

numbers, tables, graphs, or other relevant illustrations. The results presented must include all the findings obtained, without providing further interpretation or explanation. The author only needs to present the data accurately without associating it with other literature in this section.

4. DISCUSSION

The discussion is a part that interprets and analyzes the results that have been presented previously. In this section, the author should relate the research findings with relevant theories as well as previous research. The discussion should include an in-depth explanation of the implications of the findings, both hypothetical and unexpected.

The author also needs to discuss the influence of community empowerment activities on the communities involved, as well as the active participation of the community. In addition, an analysis of the adoption of innovation by the community and its impact on the sustainability of empowerment activities needs to be described in detail. This discussion aims to provide a broader understanding of research findings and their contribution to the development of science or practice in the field.

Table

All tables included in this manuscript must be included in the text with an analysis and/or explanation of their relevance or significance to the community engagement program or activity undertaken. Each table must be relevant to the study. Use horizontal lines only to separate the table header from the content and to separate the table contents from the footer. Vertical lines and excessive horizontal lines are not allowed. Tables should be referenced in text using sequential numbering (for example, Table 1, Table 2). Example of a reference in the text: "Distribution of Participant Participation Table 1."

All images and photographs included in this manuscript must be included in the text with an analysis and/or justification regarding their relevance or significance to community engagement programs or activities. All photos and images must be relevant to the study being conducted. If a group of photos or images shows a process, the group is considered as 1 (one) image. Each group of images should begin with a description that connects the images. Documentation relevant to the focus on community empowerment activities should be included.

Authors are advised not to include too many images; similar or repeated images should be presented in one representative image. Photos taken in the style of selfies or wefie, or pictures where the subject is deliberately facing the camera, are not allowed. The minimum resolution of photos and images is 300 dpi with JPEG (.jpg) extension. Use image processing software to check the dpi. Images should be referenced in text with sequential numbering (e.g., Figure 1). Example in-text reference: "Participant Presentation in *Interactive Learning*".

Graphics

Each graph included in this text must be referenced in the text, accompanied by an analysis or explanation of its relevance and significance to the community empowerment activities carried out. The graph presented must really support the study being conducted. The graphics displayed must be in 2D format, and must not use shadows or other effects.

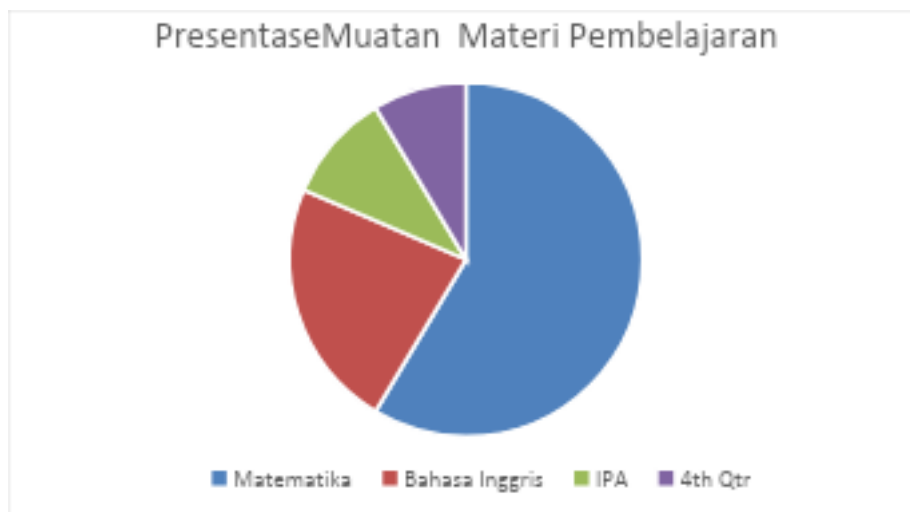


Figure 2. Graph of the Percentage of Learning Material Load

5. CONCLUSION

Write a conclusion about the extent to which the goals of the community empowerment activities are achieved. Explain how the methods applied are in accordance with the problems, needs, and challenges that exist in the activity area. Provide an analysis of the impact and benefits obtained from the empowerment activities. Also include recommendations for future enablement activities. This conclusion should be presented in the form of paragraphs, not bullet points, with a clear focus and no more than 200 words.

REFERENCES

References should be arranged in accordance with the style of the 7th edition APA consistently throughout the article. Only sources that are actually cited in the text may be included in the bibliography, and it is the author's responsibility to ensure that each reference is accurate and complete. The number of references used is suggested to be between 10 to 20 sources, with a composition of about 70% coming from scientific journals and 30% from books. To keep the study up to date, the journal references used should be published within the last five years. Authors are strongly encouraged to use reference management tools such as Zotero, EndNote, RefWorks, Reference Manager, or Mendeley in compiling bibliographies. Citation writing in the text must also follow the 7th edition APA format, either in the form of narrative quotations or quotations in parentheses,

for example (Dillard, 2020) or Dillard (2020). If more than one source is cited in a single citation, those sources should be sorted alphabetically by the first author's last name, for example (Dillard, 2020; Mamur et al., 2014). And the maximum number of articles cited is a maximum of 10 years of traffic since 2019 and complete with DOI.

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
