



- I. An article should consist of the following topics (TH SarabunPSK 16 point font type in bold):
  - 1. Background of the study
  - 2. Objective(s)
  - 3. Hypothesis (if any)
  - 4. Methodology
  - 5. Result(s)
  - 6. Discussion and conclusion
  - 7. Author contribution
  - 8. Acknowledgements (if any)
  - 9. References (APA style)

### II. Length

A full paper, including an abstract and references, must not exceed eight A4 pages.

#### III. Figures, Tables, Charts

Figures and tables must be clear and provided with short captions. Figures/charts must be numbered consecutively and referred to as Figure ....../ Chart ....... shows/illustrates (caption). They must be centred. 14 point font size is used in caption. "Figure ......"/ "Chart......" must be **bold**.

Tables should be presented with a description; that is, **Table** (its order with bold font) Heading (14 point font)

In-text citation	Using an APA (6 <sup>th</sup> ed.) style with Author-Data system
Submission file	Only Microsoft word for Windows 2007/2010 accepted

#### IV. In-text citation

In-text citation must be consistently presented in <u>an APA (6<sup>th</sup> ed.) style with Author-Data system</u>. Work is obligatorily checked on accuracy prior to submission.

#### The guidelines for in-text citation

- 1) In-text citation (Name of Author(s) and Year of Publication)
  - Name of Author(s) and Year of Publication followed by the text
  - E.g. Tamban (2017) described that ....... [ text ] .....
  - The text followed by Name of Author(s) and Year of Publication
  - E.g. .....[ text ] ...... (Tamban, 2020)



- 2) References should be separated with regard to language cited and illustrated in alphabetical order.
  - Thai references (ก-ฮ)
  - English references (A-Z)
- 3) References should correspond to in-text citation.
- 4) References must only align with left.
