<b>Purpose and Function of SEAC</b>  <a href="#">SEAC Guide Overview of Regulations</a>  School Board Policy <a href="#">BCF</a>  School Board Policy <a href="#">BCF-AR</a>  School Board Policy <a href="#">BDDL</a>	<p>Local advisory committee for special education appointed by the school board shall advise the school board through the division superintendent. The majority of SEAC members must be parents of children with disabilities or individuals with disabilities and at least one teacher. Director of Special Education Bari Nixon acts as facilitator and guide as a non-voting member. Other members will serve as consultants to the committee. All committee communications, including emails, agendas, and meeting minutes, are open to the public under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).</p> <p>Reviewed attached SEAC Guide, School Board policies BCF, BCF-AR, and BDDL, and the possibility of electronic participation in meetings via virtual link. Planning and development within SCS; primary functions are to help develop advice and recommendations about how Staunton City Schools can meet the needs of students with disabilities based on research-informed practices and facts and raise awareness of special education programs and services among city residents.</p> <p>Local examples of published sites between the districts reviewed and discussed, including the extent of resources publicly available, how accessible their committee materials are, and the differences in record keeping. Recommendations from the state include establishing operating guidelines (by-laws not needed, but many do), subject to school board approval, defining the functions of the committee;</p>

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	documenting how we conduct business, the process for appointing members, voting rules, and public comments review procedures (every meeting vs designated times).
