The consistent experience with Terry Collins of the Census of Marine Life (CoML) research program that the Sloan Foundation helps fund has been outstanding since Terry first assisted the public launch of the program in October 2003. The CBD Secretariat first engaged directly with Terry on the launch of the 5th Global Biodiversity Outlook report (2020), resulting in unprecedented levels of prominent news coverage in every region around the globe.

Working with him throughout 2022 in preparing for and during the 15th meeting of the CBD's Conference of the Parties (COP 15) was a particular highlight of our professional relationship. It was during COP 15 in December that 196 member Parties adopted the landmark Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework. In terms of impact, without question having 500 media representatives on site for COP 15 in Montreal, and more than 1,000 accredited worldwide, added significant pressure on delegates to deliver the historic, ambitious deal that they did. From the opening of COP 15 to today, we estimate that over 400 billion public impressions have been created by online media coverage alone.


