# **Capstone Project (15 Credit Hours)**

- Create an interfaith diplomacy strategy for a conflict resolution case study.
- Conduct research on the role of religious organizations in international development.
- Present findings through a comprehensive research paper and formal presentation to faculty and policymakers.

- Master diplomatic communication, policy analysis, and international negotiations.
- Understand the impact of faith-based organizations on global development and humanitarian aid.
- Develop ethical solutions for cross-cultural and religious diplomacy challenges.

- Lead initiatives in international organizations, government agencies, and NGOs with a faith-based approach.
