What is Hypothesis?

Hypothesis is an easy-to-use pedagogical tool that enables students and teachers to have conversations in the margins of digital texts.

This **social annotation tool** is installed directly in Bruin Learn and is available to you now. Adding Hypothesis to readings supports student success by placing active discussion right on top of course readings.



Why Use Hypothesis?



Critical Thinking:

Help students develop academic skills like deep reading and persuasive writing



Simplicity:

Skip complex setup, passwords and platforms
- get your students annotating their already assigned reading quickly and with support



Community:

Foster student connections as they annotate and learn together



Inclusion:

Make space for students to engage in class discussion and develop ideas at their own pace
