Party Name: Free Liberal Party

Vision Statement

To foster a society where the right to life, liberty, and property is upheld. The Free Liberal Party seeks to be a big tent for classical liberals — from minarchism, to libertarianism, and to voluntaryist ideologies.

Core Principles

- 1. Individual Liberty: Upholding the rights of individuals to pursue their own life, liberty, and property without undue interference.
- 2. Free Market Capitalism: Strong belief in market forces and economic freedom as the most efficient and just way to allocate resources and create wealth.
- 3. Limited Government/Abolition of Government: Advocating for a government that is effective yet restrained, focusing on functions like defense, justice, and infrastructure; or aiming for the elimination of the government and replacing it with a society adhering to the non-aggression principle.
- 4. Rule of Law: Ensuring a stable legal framework that protects individual rights and fosters a predictable business environment.
- 5. Personal Responsibility: Encouraging individuals to take responsibility for their actions and decisions, both economically and socially.

Economic Policies

- 1. Tax Reform/Tax Abolition: Implementing a simple, low, and flat tax/land value tax system to promote efficiency and fairness; or eliminating all taxes in the aims of establishing an anarchist society.
- 2. Regulatory Reform: Reducing red tape and unnecessary regulations that hinder entrepreneurship and innovation.
- 3. Free Trade: End tariffs and non-tariff barriers.
- 4. Fiscal Responsibility: Commitment to balanced budgets and reducing public spending and debt to ensure economic stability.

5. Privatization and Deregulation: Encouraging private sector solutions where feasible and reducing government intervention in the economy.

Social Policies

- 1. Education Choice: Supporting school choice and educational reforms that foster competition and improve quality.
- 2. Criminal Justice Reform: Advocating for fair and efficient justice systems, focusing on rehabilitation and the protection of individual rights.
- 3. Drug Policy: Supporting decriminalization of drugs and focusing on treatment rather than incarceration for non-violent drug offenses.
- 4. Civil Liberties: Protecting civil liberties, which may include freedom of speech, freedom of association, and freedom of movement. This may be supported through the non-aggression principle or through the harm principle.

Environmental and Energy Policies

- 1. Market-Based Environmental Solutions: Encouraging innovation and market-based solutions to environmental challenges.
- 2. Energy Independence: Supporting a diverse energy portfolio that includes renewable energy sources, nuclear power, and responsible fossil fuel use.

Foreign Policy

- 1. Diplomacy First: Prioritizing diplomatic efforts and peaceful negotiations in international relations. We advocate for resolving conflicts through dialogue and mutual understanding rather than military intervention.
- 2. Non-Interventionist Stance: Upholding a principle of non-intervention in the internal affairs of other nations. We believe in respecting the sovereignty of other countries and avoiding entanglements in foreign conflicts except as a last resort and only with broad international support.
- 3. Promoting Human Rights and Democracy: Advocating for human rights and democratic values globally through peaceful means. Using diplomatic channels and international cooperation to support the spread of democratic principles and human rights.
- 4. Economic Engagement Over Military Action: Leveraging economic tools, such as trade agreements and development aid, as a means of exerting influence and fostering positive relationships rather than resorting to military force.
