There is much misinformation about undocumented students and higher education. Most importantly, students should know that undocumented students, with and without Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), can attend college in Utah! All students, regardless of their immigration status, are eligible for admission to any accredited college or university in Utah, whether public or private.

College Credits in High School

Undocumented students, with and without DACA, can participate in Concurrent Enrollment, Advanced Placement, and International Baccalaureate classes while in high school. Earning college credits while still in high school can help students save time and money once they attend college.

Scholarships

While citizenship is a requirement to receive state and federal aid, Utah high school graduates do not need to provide proof of citizenship to qualify for privately funded scholarships.

In-State Tuition Waiver

Utah's House Bill 144, passed in 2002, allows qualifying undocumented and DACAmented high school graduates to pay in-state tuition rates if they attend a Utah public college or university.

To qualify, students must have attended a Utah high school for 3+ years, graduated or earned a GED in Utah, and submit an affidavit stating they will adjust their immigration status as soon as eligible.
