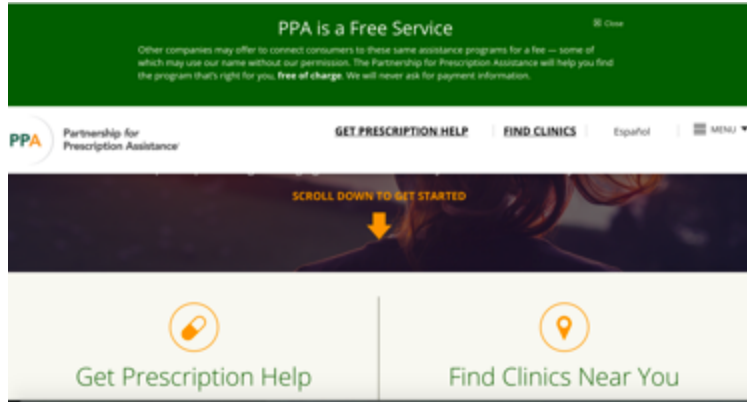

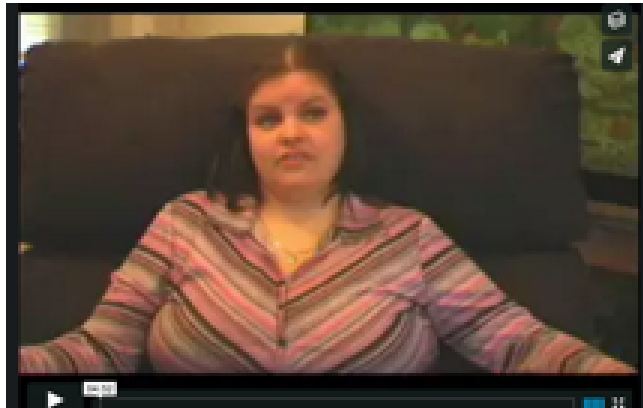

If you are uninsured, have health insurance that does not provide a prescription benefit, or have Medicare with no supplemental prescription drug coverage, you may benefit from prescription discount programs. There are several options available in Sedgwick County:

Medical Service Bureau Program Services

The Voucher Program: limited emergency financial assistance in the form of a voucher for the purchase of mainly generic prescription medications, diabetic supplies, prescription eyeglasses, and provides referrals for low-cost eye exams. We also assist the Medicare Part D beneficiaries with the prescription co-pays and/or purchasing their medications while they are in the “donut-hole”.

The Pharmaceutical Drug Program (PDP): helps clients who qualify through guidelines established by the pharmaceutical companies to access brand name prescription medications for chronic illnesses for free or at a low-cost. The Medicare Part D Prescription Drug Program decreased the number of clients we served due to constant changes place by the Pharmaceutical Companies.

Agency Requirements

Proof of Household Income: Must be within the previous 30 days for each working member in the household. For those who have no income at all must have a referral letter from a community agency or health care provider. MSB has referral forms available, if needed please call.

Proof of Identification: Must bring documentation for every person living in the household.

Proof of Address: Must bring something mailed in your name within the previous 30 days.

Proof of Insurance: Must bring insurance card for everyone in the household if you have coverage.

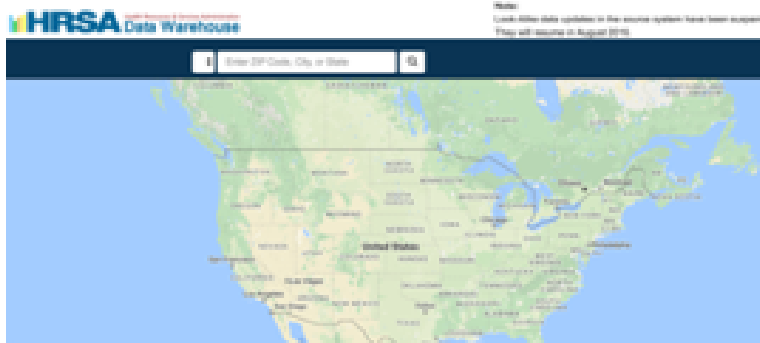

Lead poisoning is a preventable pediatric health problem affecting Kansas' children. Lead is a toxic metal that produces many adverse health effects. Lead poisoning is a disease caused by exposure to and the absorption of lead. It is persistent and cumulative. It does not degrade. Childhood Lead Poisoning occurs in all population groups and income brackets.

Early identification and treatment of lead poisoning reduces the risk that children will suffer permanent damage. A blood lead test is the only way to tell if a child has an elevated blood level.

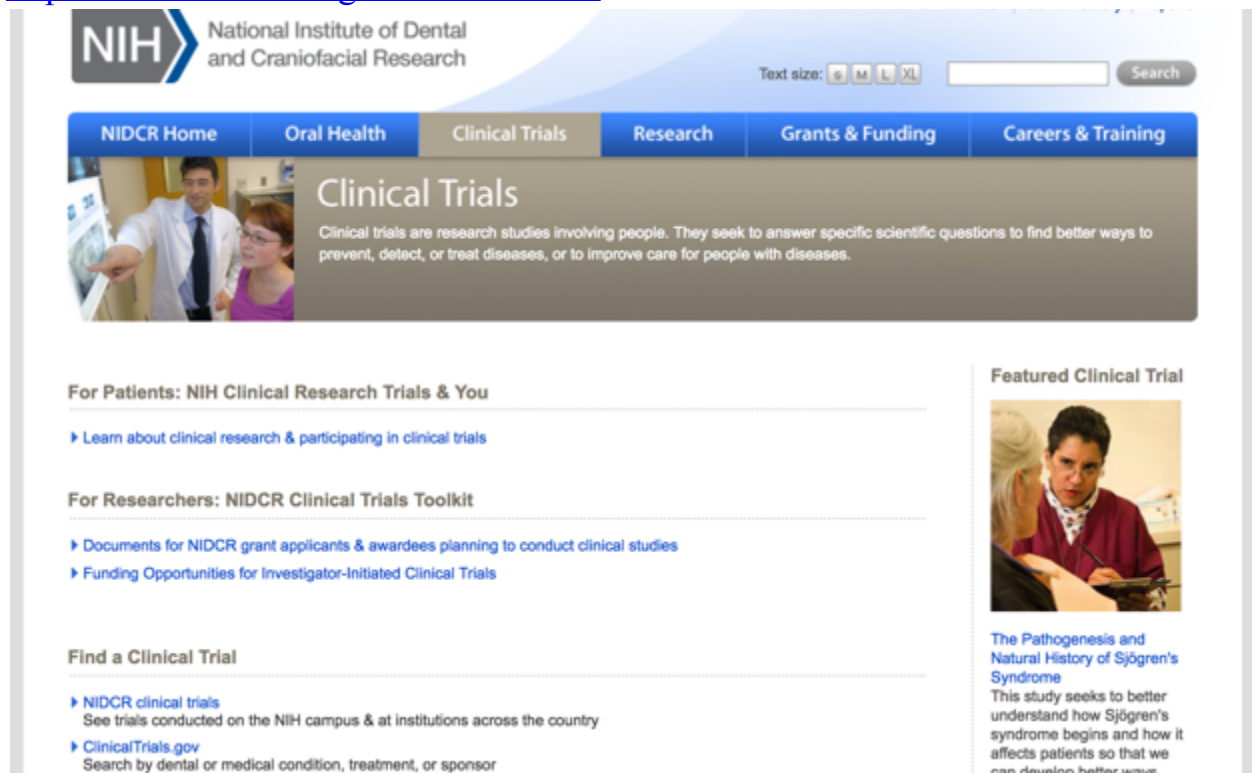

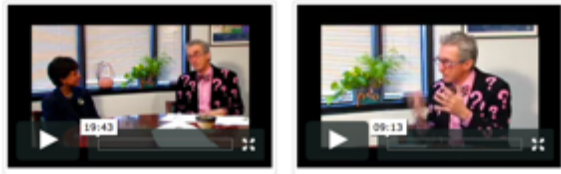

Medicare doesn't cover most dental care, dental procedures, or supplies, like cleanings, fillings, tooth extractions, dentures, dental plates, or other dental devices. Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) will pay for certain dental services that you get when you're in a hospital. Part A can pay for if you need to have emergency or complicated dental procedures, even though the dental care isn't covered.

***Dental Care for Children Up to 19 Years

CHIP is a state-run program for children whose families earn too much to qualify for Medicaid but can't afford private insurance. CHIP provides dental services to children up to age 19.
