Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces; or
Participate in an approved JROTC program

For students interested in a career pathway that includes serving in a branch of the armed forces, the Military Enlistment Seal is an option to satisfy components of Ohio's graduation requirements. To earn Ohio's Military Enlistment Seal, students must complete one of the following: 1. Show evidence of enlistment in a branch of the armed services; or 2. Participate in a JROTC program. The following sections outline the criteria for satisfying the requirements listed above.

To show evidence of enlistment, a student will: • Provide to the district or school a signed copy of the Department of Defense Form Enlistment/Reenlistment (DD Form 4) enlistment contract. After taking and achieving the required score on the ASVAB and completing the oath of enlistment into the Delayed Training Program, each recruit signs and is provided a copy of his or her Department Defense Form Enlistment/Reenlistment (DD Form 4) enlistment contract. This is same for all branch of services. Students must submit this documentation to demonstrate evidence of enlistment.

A student can:

1. Earn a score of proficient or higher on both the American history and American government end-of-course exams;
2. Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient on appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate exams; or
3. Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in appropriate classes taken through the College Credit Plus program.
4. Earn a "B" or higher in both American History and American Government

Fine Art:

Student must complete 3 years of art.

OR Develop a comprehensive portfolio (Must work with Mr. Mountz on criteria)
Documentation and signature approval from supervisor required

Performing Arts:

Each musical activity at the high school level earns a student one point per year they have participated in the event. In order to earn the performing arts seal, students must receive at least 10 points by their senior year through any combination of the following:

- Band
- Choir
- Marching Band
- Solo and Ensemble: if a student participates in both band and choir contest, they will receive two points that year. The student must also score a 1, 2, or 3 to receive the point.
- Jazz Band
- Pep Band
- Musicals/Theater: students will receive one point per musical. Points will also be given to students who are on stage crew.

Earn one of six Honors Diplomas outlined below:

1. Academic Honors Diploma;
2. International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma;
3. Career-Tech Honors Diploma;
4. STEM Honors Diploma;
5. Arts Honors Diploma;
6. Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma.

Academic Honors Diploma Criteria (Can be exempt from one):

- 4 English credits
- 4 Math credits (one being higher level than algebra 2)
- 4 Science credits (2 must be advanced)
- 4 Social Studies credits
- 3 credits from the same foreign language or 2 years each of 2 languages
- 1 Fine Art credit
- 3.5 GPA
- 27 on ACT (can superscore)

Math subscore of 22 or higher
Reading subscore of 22 or higher
English subscore of 18 or higher

Students must meet the following criteria:

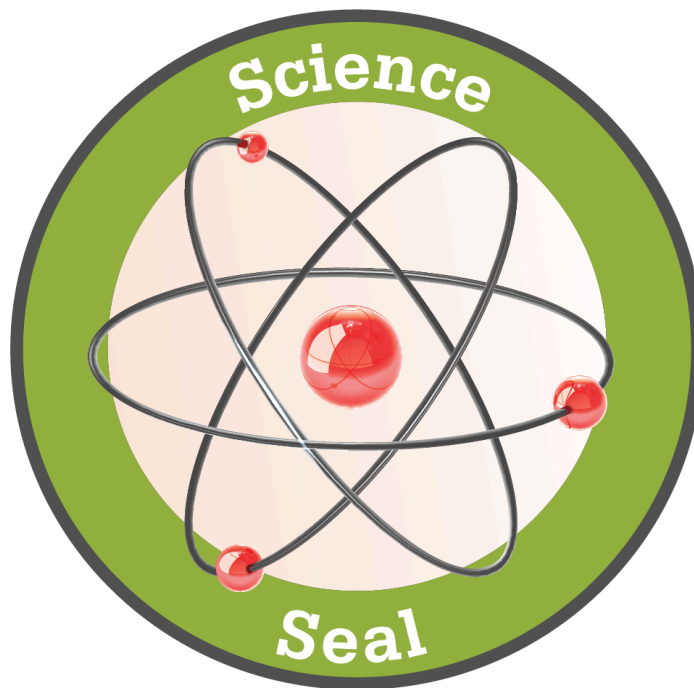
1. 30 hours of volunteer service in the community. (NHS students will have this already)
2. Must document hours
3. Must have supervisor verification & evaluation
 - *The student must submit a supervisor evaluation that verifies the work and reports on the demonstration of the identified competencies or skills.
4. Students must write a reflective essay on the experience.

- 3. Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a “B” or higher in an appropriate class taken through the College Credit Plus program.**
- 5. Earn a a “B” or higher in Biology and an advanced science course (must be from the list of advanced courses that will count for this)**

3. Complete a course offered through the district or school that meets guidelines developed by the Department.
