Suggested responses

- (a) The symbolism lies in describing the frog as selfish and cunning while describing the nightingale as a symbol of credulous, timid and gullible people. The frog symbolizes deception while the nightingale symbolizes people who lack common sense and are unable to judge people.
- (b) The name of Miss Mebbin's cottage, "Les Fauves" means 'wild beasts'. It is ironical because Miss Mebbin was able to buy this villa only by threatening and blackmailing Mrs. Packletide about her shooting of the wrong animal, the goat, instead of the tiger.
- (c) In the story, "Two Gentlemen of Verona" Jacopo and Nicola had lost everything in the war including their father and their house. However, their indomitable spirit was not destroyed. It toughened them to face the situations bravely and later take care of their sister's treatment.
- (d) The narrator's father was most crazy about computers, for he bought a lot of things related with computers at the Computer Fair. He bought a Pentium Processor, a RAM, 1.2 GB hard disc and 16 speed CD ROMs, with speakers, printers, modem and a scanner.

Suggested responses

(A) Mrs. Slater was not very happy with the mourning dresses that she and her family were wearing. In fact, she had ordered new dresses for everybody. She was not concerned about the death of her father but was more bothered about her looks and how to be better than her sister.

(B) The Ancient Mariner in the poem 'The Rime of Ancient Mariner', has to pay for his impulsive act of killing the Albatross.
