- ActiveMQ Queues for each of 4 consumers; using a cert. for the connection, contents are encrypted in transit
- JimmyV: Debate on 1 queue per consumer, or some kind of functional division; Fan of 1 queue per consumer;
- Eric: AMQ can run out of space if a consumer dies. That's one reason to switch for Amazon: TimeOut feature
- JV: ChrisH@Penn is also looking at Amazon; encrypting and signing (built into AWS);
  We JSON-encode the data; EKB: XML now, but when we switch to Am outer will be
  JSON, inner will still be XML; outer is metadata: timestamp, version,...
- JV: We monitor the queues, but we're actually using PostGres rather than Kaha? EKB: we lost our DB guy on AMQ, so that was a factor in decision to switch to A. All the A stuff is RESTful; EKB: Good libraries that wrap it: Fox/Python&C to EKB/.Net
- EKB: Cost is a factor against AMQ; 50k/mo messages; Jim's code is smart, coalesce's events across a 4-second window; MRG wants to do that, too, at CMU; We do course groups can happen as fast as the code; The cost for A is message count and bandwidth;
- 10k ppl added to a group might be one message; JV: Registrar have always felt that course rosters shouldn't be visible; EKB: viewership restrictions (in both Grouper and AD) placed on course and other sensitive groups
- Identity Registry to LDAP and/or AD (including but not limited to OR and CPR identity registries)
