<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> According to our standing rules, discussion at first readings should be limited to 10 minutes. A Senator can always move to extend discussion of an item by a certain number of minutes. We don't have enough time for 10 minutes for every item, so hopefully some items will go faster.
