One student makes a yarn shape--other students "air write" the same shape.

Can they air write from the top down? From the bottom up? From left to right? From right to left? These squiggles are a foundational element of art--LINE. Lines in are are sometimes obvious, and sometimes hidden.

Once students feel comfortable imitating with gross motor, they should try to draw the line shape (dry erase or on paper)

"Now let's turn these squiggles into lines, just like real artists!"

Practice making different kinds of shapes with gross and fine motor including:

- Straight lines
- Curved lines
- Curlycue lines
- Zigzag lines

Make a squiggle art heart--give the students a paper with a heart shape already on it. Instead of using yarn (as in the model) children **draw** squiggles that intersect. 


