Please upload the final abstract as pdf. Please check that figures, special characters, maths, etc, appear as you wish them to (i.e. not corrupted by the conversion to pdf)

We will produce a pdf abstract book which will be available to all participants of ECOSS2026. Please think about this when preparing your abstract and avoid including anything that you do not wish to share (i.e. confidential or copyright protected content).

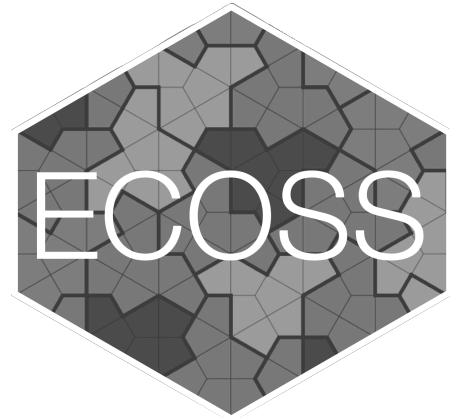


Figure 1 [11pt bold]: Write a caption which explains your figure. For example: The ECOSS2026 logo is an example of aperiodic einstein tiling, showing a single tile which by rotation, translation and inversion fills all space. The name "einstein" is a wordplay of "one stone" [1] and not connected with the physicist [2] of the same name. [11pt regular]
