This week's Parsha: Vayelech

This weeks Parsha begins with the hebrew, וַיַּלֶךְ מֹשֶׁה וְיְדַבֶּר אֶת־הַדְּבָרִים הָאֻלֶּה אָל־כָּל־יִשְרְאֵל Vayelech Moshe v'yidaber et-had'varim haeleh el-col-yisrael... And Moses went and spoke all of these words to the people of Israel.

In his efforts to go and speak to every member of the people Moses is making an effort to demonstrate to them that they are not alone and they are a part of a larger community. This is a fitting Parshah to take us into Yom Kippur. Just as the people of Israel were reminded by Moshe that they are not alone in this journey, we are also reminded that we are also not alone when we are Adat. It is our responsibility to seek out those who are alone and remind them that they are part of *Kehillah Kedosha* (our holy community).

Subject	What We Did in Class	Questions You Might Ask Your Child
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Language Arts Ms. Graham	Writing: We are focusing on our first paragraph of the year. Over the past few weeks we have discussed, read stories and drew pictures of our summer. Each child chose their favorite summer memory and drew 3 pictures about that event. This week's focus was on creating a topic sentence that would "hook" their reader. They will use their pictures to help them create detailed sentences in weeks ahead.	What was your favorite summer memory? What are three things you did during this event?
	Reading: We started the first story in our new reading series. The essential question of the week was, "How do friends depend on each other?" There was a class discussion about friendship, how we treat our friends, and how we want our friends to treat us. The first story we read on the topic of friendship, was called, "Little Flap Learns to Fly."	How do you depend on you friends, and how do you like your friends to treat you?
Social Studies Ms. Graham	The first week of school we focused on our feelings on the first day, and we discussed the goals we want to accomplish during our year in second grade. We will continue this "About Me" unit by sharing our bags full of important objects from home. This activities gives me and the rest of the class the opportunity to get to know eachother better. Judaic Studies Morah Mali	Morning prayers are recited now from the Siddur. The month of Tishri-the first Jewish month in the calendar was introduced with its main holidays. We studied about Rosh Hashanah's main symbols. The shofar was blown in class by Cantor Aranoff and we dipped apples in honey as saying the bracha. Hebrew Morah Mali	The beginning of the school year started with a review of the Hebrew letters/vowels we've studied last year. We are practicing reading Hebrew with much more fluency and accuracy. We are starting the cursive program introduced in the fifth Hebrew book in our Hebrew program. We are practicing writing and saying a complete sentence in Hebrew using the correct grammatical rules of the Hebrew languages using a pronoun, a verb and a noun. Science Mr. Abelson	Second grade has been participating in a take-a-part activity. Students dismantled and took apart a keyboard. Each part of the keyboard was separated and counted. This is part of a larger lesson that large things are made of smaller objects.	How many parts were part of your computer?
Art Miss Mimi	Students created paper sculptures that reflected the unique qualities they possess.	What is a sculpture?

Music Ronit	The students are learning the new school song, "If Not Now, Tell me When"	Can you sing the new school song? How does it go?
Dance Adi Licht	In second grade, we learned about dance spacing and a dance window. We learned how to isolate different parts of our body (head, chest etc.) and then we learned how to break down body and arm waves. We were introduced to breakdance floor work and worked on our "coffee grinder." Class ended with students exploring their "freestyle"- dance moves the students themselves create/ choreograph.
