The DBIO program committee is pleased to announce that the application window for the DBIO Early Career Prize session at the APS Global Physics Summit 2025 is now open. This session will consist of invited talks from the recipient of the Early Career Award for Biological Physics and the recipient of the Award for Outstanding Doctoral Thesis Research in Biological Physics, in addition to nine talks from abstracts contributed by graduate students and postdocs which will be selected from applications (see below). Prizes will be awarded based on the content and quality of the presentation. Winners will be announced and recognized at the DBIO Business meeting and will receive award certificates and cash prizes.

Deadline for applications is October 25, 2024.

Applications will consist of:

- title and abstract of the submitted APS Global Physics Summit abstract (submitted as usual to the focus session or sorting category of your choice)
- a short CV
- a short nomination letter by the faculty advisor (which should address why this work deserves to be recognized and the presentation skills of the nominee).

Applicants should be graduate students or postdocs who are current DBIO members. Applicants who are not selected for the Prize session will have their abstracts sorted for presentation as usual.
