Requirements and Procedures for Registered Sandplay Practitioners, Certified Sandplay Therapists, and Certified Teaching Members

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## Chapter 1. Introduction and Overview

#### 1.1 Mission Statement

Sandplay Therapists of America® (STA) is a nonprofit organization established to train, support, and promote professional development in sandplay in the tradition of Dora Kalff and based on the theories of C.G. Jung. STA is a member society of the International Society for Sandplay Therapy (ISST).

#### 1.2 Introduction

As envisioned and developed by Dora M. Kalff, sandplay requires engaging the total person of the therapist in the ongoing process of transformative inner work. Becoming a member of Sandplay Therapists of America, therefore, necessitates the continuing commitment of the therapist to personal and psychological growth. You are not alone in this process. An important part of your journey toward becoming a sandplay therapist is mentoring and support. Do not hesitate to reach out to our STA community along the way.

The application process serves as a point of entry into a way of life characterized by this continual self-exploration and development. Fidelity to this process enhances the quality of the "free and protected space" provided by the therapist. This handbook presents requirements and procedures that promote and solidify the personal and professional commitment on the part of the sandplay therapist.

Sandplay Therapists of America recognizes four levels of membership: Associate Member, Registered Sandplay Practitioner, STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapist, and STA/ISST Teaching Member, the latter three levels requiring an application. We are a nonprofit organization that operates as an all-volunteer service organization, with administrative support from a few staff members. We depend on our members to vote and create the Board of Trustees, as well as to run the organization within our written and accepted bylaws and code of ethics. It is important for every new Certified and Teaching Member of STA to consider how they may serve this organization, both regionally and nationally, for it is only with our membership actively involved that sandplay continues to thrive and grow.

We look forward to your involvement and support of this organization. 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#### 1.3 Definitions and Abbreviations

**STA** – Sandplay Therapists of America®

**ISST** – International Society for Sandplay Therapy

**STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Training**® – Workshops, trainings, and conferences offered through Sandplay Therapists of America® (STA) and by STA/ISST Certified Teaching Members (CST-T) consistent with topics listed in the Sandplay Curriculum Guide (<u>Appendix A</u>).


**Registered Sandplay Practitioner (RSP)** – RSPs are recognized as having completed basic training requirements in sandplay as outlined in this handbook. Registered Sandplay Practitioners are a category of membership unique to STA, and as such, are not members of ISST.

**CST Candidate** – This status represents an intermediate step in the process of becoming a Certified Sandplay Therapist. When an applicant has completed all of their education hours, half of their case consultation hours, and one of their initial papers, they may submit their application. After completing the advisory interview, the applicant is advanced to CST Candidate status, and then completes the remainder of the requirements. See <a href="Chapter 3">Chapter 3</a> for complete details and requirements.

**Certified Sandplay Therapist** (**CST**) – CSTs are recognized as meeting advanced training requirements as outlined in this handbook and are members of STA and ISST. Certified Sandplay Therapists may offer sandplay process hours to trainees who are seeking STA/ISST membership.

**Certified Sandplay Therapist** – **Teacher (CST-T)** – Teaching Members are certified members who meet the teacher requirements outlined in this handbook. Teaching Members may offer personal sandplay process to trainees who are seeking STA/ISST membership, conduct sandplay education and training and case consultation, and may use the term STA/ISST Certified Training.

## Chapter 2. Registered Sandplay Practitioner (RSP) Information

To apply for membership as a Registered Sandplay Practitioner in Sandplay Therapists of America, individuals must meet the following minimum education and training requirements.

## 2.1 RSP Pre-Qualifications

## 1. Post-Graduate Degree

**Requirement:** Graduate degree in a helping profession such as medicine, psychology, social work, counseling, art therapy, school counseling, or marriage and family therapy from a regionally accredited university.

**To document:** Submit a copy of proof of conferred degree (transcript or diploma).

## 2. Clinical Knowledge Base

**Requirement:** Knowledge of psychotherapy, psychopathology and diagnosis, and psychology obtained through formal study and supervised internship experience.

**To document:** List coursework in each area on **Form E&T**.

## 3. Licensure

**Requirement:** License in a mental health field.

**To document:** Upload a copy of license to **Form E&T**.

## 4. Malpractice Insurance

**Requirement:** Malpractice insurance in your respective professional discipline.

**To document:** Upload a copy of current malpractice insurance to the RSP application (<u>Form RSP-APP</u>).

#### 5. STA Associate Membership

**Requirement:** Those applying for RSP certification are required to be STA Associate members.

**Rationale:** To develop resources, to access the *Journal of Sandplay Therapy*®, and to build a supportive community of practice, all persons interested in sandplay therapy are encouraged to become Associate members of STA. For those pursuing credentialing in sandplay, Associate membership is recommended early in the training process.

## 2.2 RSP Education and Training Requirements

## 1. Personal Sandplay Process

**Requirement:** An honest, transformative personal sandplay process is the most significant, foundational requirement of the training sequence. The process must occur with an STA/ISST Certified Member. A **minimum of 40 hours** (not sand trays) is suggested for the completion of the personal sandplay process. Although no specific number of sand trays is required, it is generally accepted that a **minimum of 30 sand trays** is necessary to experience an in-depth sandplay process.

**Rationale:** Engaging fully in a personal sandplay process provides an essential foundation for sandplay practice. Dora Kalff asserts that to accompany others in sandplay therapy—a journey into the unconscious—it is necessary to have a deep, personal experience doing one's own sandplay process.

Frau Kalff emphasizes two "all-important" prerequisite competencies for sandplay practice that are rooted in personal process: (1) profound knowledge of symbolic language that comes from one's own psychic experience, and (2) being capable of holding the "free and protected space" for others by developing awareness of one's own dark or unknown sides as well as one's own deep-seated positive potential.¹

**Timing:** Although it may overlap with the completion of other training requirements, it is suggested that the sandplay process begins prior to pursuing formal study of sandplay theory and practice.

**To document:** Complete <u>Form PSP</u>, which is then forwarded to your personal process therapist to attest to the dates of therapy and completion of the minimum requirements.

## 2. Sandplay Education and Training

## Requirements<sup>2</sup>:

- A minimum of **36 hours** of didactic and experiential sandplay education and training with an STA/ISST Teaching Member or at an STA- or ISST-sponsored conference, seminar, or workshop.
  - o **18 hours** of those 36 must be an introductory course in sandplay.
  - Please refer to the **Sandplay Training Curriculum Guide** (<u>Appendix A</u>) for a detailed listing of content areas and suggested themes for study.
- A maximum of 20 of the 36 hours may be earned through online courses that meet requirements for STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Training.
  - Live, interactive webinars are intended as the primary means to acquire online education and training hours.
  - A maximum of 6 of the online hours may be asynchronous (self-study), provided the course meets STA requirements and is approved for university credit or CEs from a professional organization (such as APA, NASW, or ACA) and includes a post-test.
  - **Note:** All eligible online live/interactive training hours completed during the COVID-19 exception period (February 1, 2020 to December 31, 2023) are considered "in person" training, and not subject to the online maximum.

**Timing:** Fundamentals of sandplay therapy may be studied prior to, concurrently with, or after experiencing the personal sandplay process. It is suggested that further study and clinical sandplay practice be delayed until after the personal sandplay process is meaningfully underway.

**Rationale:** Obtaining practical and theoretical knowledge as outlined in the Sandplay Training Curriculum Guide (<u>Appendix A</u>), along with participating in experiential learning opportunities, provide a necessary foundation for developing competency in sandplay practice.

**To document:** The applicant is responsible for maintaining a record of lectures, workshops, seminars, and conferences attended. **Form E&T** requires submission of a list of training events attended (including dates, location, presenter, and number of training hours awarded) and upload of completion certificates.

#### 3. Case Consultation

**Requirement:** Applicants must seek case consultation from an STA/ISST Teaching Member other than the therapist with whom they completed their sandplay process.

- It is assumed that trainees seeking consultation are actively practicing sandplay.
- **Individual consultation:** 15 hours are required if all case consultation is individual.
- **Group consultation: 25 hours** are required if all consultation is group, provided the trainee presents their own case material **at least 20%** of the total group consultation hours.
- Combination individual and group consultation: 20 hours are required, provided the trainee presents their own client case material at least 20% of total group hours.

**Additional requirements** for case consultation are found in Appendix B.

**Rationale:** The purpose of consultation is to facilitate the exploration and enhancement of one's own clinical work.

**Timing:** It is recommended that consultation be delayed until after the applicant's personal sandplay process is complete or at least meaningfully underway. It is also recommended that trainees are working with at least three (3) clients per week who have engaged with sandplay on a regular basis for a significant period of time (i.e., at least 9 to 12 months).

**To document:** List consultation sessions (date, consultant name, session format, hours, and [for group sessions] hours presenting) on <u>Form E&T</u> and upload either completion certificate or letter from each consultant verifying hours.

#### 2.3 Connecting with the STA Community

## 1. Letters of Recommendation

RSP applicants are required to have **two** (2) **letters of recommendation** from STA colleagues who are familiar with the applicant and their work. One or both letters can be submitted by STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapists or Teaching Members; one letter may be from a Registered Sandplay Practitioner.<sup>3</sup>

**To document:** Applicant and recommenders complete **Form RSP-LOR**.

**Rationale:** Letters of recommendation provide endorsement from colleagues who know the applicant.

## 2. Advisor (optional)

It is recommended, but not required, that RSP applicants choose an advisor early in their training process. The advisor must be an STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapist or Teaching Member and may not be the applicant's personal process therapist.<sup>4</sup> (*Note:* While optional at the RSP level, an advisor is required at the time of CST application.)

See **Chapter 5** for detailed advisor information.

**Rationale:** Applicants benefit from guidance and support during the training and application process from an experienced sandplay therapist.

**To document:** Both parties sign the Applicant/Advisor Agreement (Form ADV).

## 2.4 Applying for Registered Sandplay Practitioner Membership



## **2.5 RSP Membership Process**

The Registered Sandplay Practitioner application is reviewed by the Admissions Committee. Upon completed review, the trainee is notified of results and any follow-up required. Once prorated dues are paid, a Certificate of Registered Membership is issued.

# Chapter 3. STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapist (CST) Information

The process for becoming a Certified Sandplay Therapist (CST) includes a set of pre-qualifications that builds on the requirements for Registered Sandplay Practitioner, followed by education and training, personal development, and case consultation. The trainee applies to become a CST after having met all of the education/training and approximately half of the additional requirements, including the first symbol paper. The Admissions Chair then arranges an advisory interview. After the interview is complete, the applicant is advanced to Candidate for CST status and then completes the remaining hours of training and writing to become certified, as shown in the diagram below.



## 3.1 CST Pre-Oualifications

(Items 1–5 below are identical to Registered Sandplay Practitioner pre-qualifications)

#### 1. Post-Graduate Degree

**Requirement:** Graduate degree in a helping profession such as medicine, psychology, social work, counseling, art therapy, school counseling, or marriage and family therapy from a regionally accredited university.

**To document:** Submit a copy of proof of conferred degree (transcript or diploma).

## 2. Clinical Knowledge Base

**Requirement:** Knowledge of psychotherapy, psychopathology and diagnosis, and psychology obtained through formal study and supervised internship experience.

**To document:** List coursework in each area on **Form E&T**.

#### 3. Licensure

**Requirement:** License in a mental health field.

**To document:** Upload a copy of license to **Form E&T**.

## 4. Malpractice Insurance

**Requirement:** Malpractice insurance in your respective professional discipline.

**To document:** Upload a copy of current malpractice insurance to **Form CST-APP**.

## 5. STA Associate Membership

**Requirement:** Those applying for CST certification are required to be STA Associate members.

**Rationale:** To develop resources, to access to the *Journal of Sandplay Therapy*®, and to build a supportive community of practice, all persons interested in sandplay therapy are encouraged to become Associate members of STA. For those pursuing credentialing in sandplay, Associate membership is recommended early in the training process. (Those who are Registered Sandplay practitioners have already met this requirement.)

## 6. Personal Development

**Requirement:** In-depth inner development such as Jungian analysis, personal psychotherapy, or other intensive psychological work. A **minimum of 100 hours** of personal development, including personal sandplay process (described below), is required.

**To document:** On <u>Form E&T</u>, list each therapist's name, type(s) of therapy or personal development, location, dates attended, and total hours.

## **3.2 CST Education and Training Requirements**

#### 1. Personal Sandplay Process

**Requirement:** An honest, transformative personal sandplay process is the most significant, foundational requirement of the training sequence. The process must occur with an STA/ISST Certified Member. A **minimum of 40 hours** (not sand trays) is suggested for the completion of the personal sandplay process. Although no specific number of sand trays is required, it is generally accepted that a **minimum of 30 sand trays** is necessary to experience an in-depth sandplay process.

**Rationale:** Engaging fully in a personal sandplay process provides an essential foundation for sandplay practice. Dora Kalff asserts that to accompany others in sandplay therapy—a journey into the unconscious—it is necessary to have a deep, personal experience doing one's own sandplay process.

**To document:** Complete <u>Form PSP</u>, which is then forwarded to your personal process therapist to attest to the dates of therapy and completion of the minimum requirements.

#### 2. Advisor

**Requirement:** To apply for Certified Membership, an applicant must choose an advisor who is an STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapist or Teaching Member and who is not the applicant's personal process therapist.<sup>6</sup> See <a href="Chapter 5">Chapter 5</a> for detailed advisor information.

**Rationale:** Applicants benefit from guidance and support during the training and application process from an experienced sandplay therapist.

**Timing:** It is recommended that applicants choose an advisor early in their training process.

**To document:** Both parties sign the Applicant/Advisor Agreement (Form ADV).

## 3. Sandplay Education and Training

## Requirements7:

- A comprehensive program of study including a minimum of 120 hours of didactic and experiential sandplay education and training with an STA/ISST Teaching Member or at an STA- or ISST-sponsored conference, seminar, or workshop. All education and training hours must be completed before submitting an application for CST.
- The minimum hours of coursework in each content area are as follows. (*Note*: Some courses include multiple topics.)

<u>Topic</u>	Minimum hours
Fundamentals of sandplay therapy	18
Clinical sandplay practice	48
Jungian theory	18
Symbolism	18

- A maximum of 70 of the 120 hours may be earned through online courses that meet requirements for STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Training.
  - Live, interactive webinars are intended as the primary means to acquire online education and training hours.
  - A maximum of 12 of the online hours may be asynchronous (self-study), provided the course meets STA requirements and is approved for university credit or CEs from a professional organization (such as APA, NASW, or ACA) and includes a post-test.
  - **Note:** All eligible online live/interactive training hours completed during the COVID-19 exception period (February 1, 2020 to December 31, 2023) are considered "in person" training, and not subject to the online maximum.

**Timing:** Fundamentals of sandplay therapy may be studied prior to, concurrently with, or after experiencing the personal sandplay process. It is suggested that further study and clinical sandplay practice be delayed until after the personal sandplay process is meaningfully underway.

**Rationale:** Obtaining practical and theoretical knowledge as outlined in the Sandplay Training Curriculum Guide (<u>Appendix A</u>), along with participating in experiential learning opportunities, provide a necessary foundation for developing competency in sandplay practice.

**To document:** The applicant is responsible for maintaining a record of lectures, workshops, seminars, and conferences attended. **Form E&T** requires submission of a list of training events attended (including dates, location, presenter, and number of training hours awarded) and upload of completion certificates.

#### 4. Case Consultation

**Requirement:** Applicants must seek case consultation from an STA/ISST Teaching Member other than the therapist with whom they completed their sandplay process.

- It is assumed that trainees seeking consultation are actively practicing sandplay.
- A minimum of **80 hours** of sandplay case consultation is required.
  - At least 40 hours of the 80 required must be completed before application for Certified Sandplay Therapist.
- **Individual consultation:** At least **30 hours** of the 80 required must be individual case consultation.

• **Group consultation:** Up to **50** hours of consultation may be in a group format, provided the trainee presents their own case material **at least 20**% of the total group consultation hours.

**Additional requirements** for case consultation are found in <u>Appendix B</u>.

**Rationale:** The purpose of consultation is to facilitate the exploration and enhancement of one's own clinical work.

**Timing:** It is recommended that consultation be delayed until after the applicant's personal sandplay process is complete or at least meaningfully underway. It is also recommended that trainees are working with at least three (3) clients per week who have engaged with sandplay on a regular basis for a significant period of time (i.e., at least 9 to 12 months).

**To document:** List consultation sessions (date, consultant name, session format, hours, and [for group sessions] hours presenting) on <u>Form E&T</u> and upload either completion certificate or letter from each consultant verifying hours.

## 5. Initial Papers

**Requirements: Two (2) initial papers** are required. Each paper must be **10 to 20 pages** in length, using 12-point font and 1.5 line spacing.

- The first paper should be an in-depth exploration of a symbol or archetypal image.
- The second paper may be an exploration of a different symbol, a theme, or any theoretical aspect of sandplay of interest to the applicant.
- At least one paper must contain clinical sandplay material from clients (up to three photos of sand trays).

**Approval:** Each initial paper must be approved by an STA/ISST Teaching Member in good standing, who is not the personal process therapist or advisor, and who does not have a close personal relationship with the applicant (see <u>Appendix C</u> for detailed paper guidelines).

**Timing:** The first paper must be approved prior to submitting the application for Certified Sandplay Therapist. The second paper is submitted after the application is submitted and an advisory interview has taken place, and before the final case paper is submitted.

**Rationale:** Writing initial papers provides the applicant an opportunity to develop and demonstrate fundamental knowledge and applications of symbolic language and sandplay theory.

**To document:** Reader completes the initial paper assessment (**Form CST-PAPER**); copies are automatically sent to the applicant, advisor, and STA.

## 6. Advisory Interview

**Requirement:** Once the application is reviewed by the Admissions Committee, the applicant is scheduled for an interview with an Advisory Committee, who meets with the applicant, summarizes the applicant's strengths, and makes suggestions for ongoing development. See <u>Appendix D</u> for more information.

**Timing:** In-person interviews are generally scheduled in conjunction with STA events. Virtual interviews are scheduled at the convenience of the applicant and the interview committee.

**Rationale:** The purpose of the advisory interview is to create a welcoming atmosphere and to provide helpful, constructive feedback to applicants in order to assist them in acquiring thorough, well-rounded, integrated training in sandplay.

## 7. Final Case Paper

**Paper requirements:** The final case paper is a written report covering the entire therapeutic process for one client whose case is closed. In the paper, the Candidate for CST must demonstrate their understanding of the depth of the sandplay process; the number of trays should be sufficient to show the development and transformation of the symbolic process.

- The final case paper must be **30 to 50 pages** of text (12,000 to 18,500 words), using 12-point font and 1.5 line spacing.
- An additional file containing photos of all of the client's sand trays is submitted.
- Candidate must secure written permission from the client (or the client's parent/guardian) for inclusion in the study (<u>sample release form</u>) and retain the client permission in their personal files. In the paper, the client is referred to using a pseudonym only, to ensure confidentiality.
- See <u>Appendix E</u> for detailed paper requirements.

## **Reader requirements:**

- Case studies must have two (2) STA readers and one (1) from another ISST society.
- A reader must not have been the candidate's therapist, advisor, case consultant, or have had a prior personal relationship with the candidate.
- The candidate's advisor can assist with selection of potential readers; a list of approved readers can be found on <u>the STA website</u>.

**Rationale:** Writing a final case paper provides the applicant an opportunity to develop and demonstrate competence in integrating theory with practice, and in gaining understanding of the depth of a sandplay process in one's own clinical work.

**Approval:** Case readers complete <u>Form CST-CASE</u>. All of their communications—questions, requests, and final assessment—are conducted with the advisor, not with the applicant directly. Detailed procedures are described in <u>Appendix E</u>.

**Timing:** Readers are expected to complete their evaluation within approximately two (2) months of receiving the case study.

Fee: A \$100 fee is paid to each reader at the time the case is submitted to them.

## 3.3 Requirements for Jungian Analysts

Certified Jungian Analysts (JA) may undergo an adapted training for STA/ISST Certified Membership. The **pre-qualifications and requirements described above** for Certified Membership **still apply**, with the following modifications. Jungian Analysts complete **Form CST-APP-IA** to apply for Certified Sandplay Therapist.

1. Personal Sandplay Process

Same requirements as described above.

2. Advisor

Same requirements as described above.

3. Education and Training

Applicant must complete **60 hours** of specific STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Training. Please refer to the **Sandplay Training Curriculum Guide** (<u>Appendix A</u>) for a detailed listing of content areas and suggested themes for study.

• **18 of the 60 hours** must be an introductory course in sandplay.

- A maximum of 50 of the 60 hours may be earned through live, interactive
  online courses that meet requirements for STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Training.
  - Online asynchronous (self-study) courses are not permitted for Jungian Analyst candidates.
- **Note:** All eligible online live/interactive training hours completed during the COVID-19 exception period (February 1, 2020 to December 31, 2023) are considered "in person" training, and not subject to the online maximum.

#### 4. Case Consultation

**Requirement:** Applicants must seek case consultation from an STA/ISST Teaching Member other than the therapist with whom they completed their personal sandplay process.

- A minimum of **40 hours** of sandplay case consultation is required.
- **Individual consultation:** At least **15 hours** of the 40 required must be individual case consultation.
- **Group consultation:** Up to **25 hours** of consultation may be in group format, provided the trainee presents their own case material **at least 20**% of the total group consultation hours.

**Additional requirements** for case consultation are found in <u>Appendix B</u>.

## 5. Initial Papers

**Requirement:** Submission and approval of **one** (1) **paper** with sandplay clinical material.

## 6. Advisory Interview

Not required for the Jungian Analyst.

## 7. Final Case Paper

Same requirements as described above.

## **3.4 CST Application Process**

## Final Steps

Following the interview, the candidate completes the second initial paper, the remainder of the case consultation hours, and the final case study. Once all CST requirements have been met (as described in sections 3.1 and 3.2), the candidate submits an Application Addendum (Form CST-ADD) and an updated Form E&T.

The CST application and addendum is reviewed by the Admissions Committee. Upon completed review, the applicant is notified of results and any follow-up required. The Admissions Chair then submits the complete application to ISST for review. Once prorated dues are paid, a Certificate of Certified Membership is issued.

**Timing:** There is no time limit for completion of the final requirements for Certified Membership.

## Chapter 4. STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapist – Teacher (CST-T) Information

#### **4.1 CST-T Requirements**

An STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapist – Teacher (CST-T or Teaching Member) is not only a fine clinician and an excellent teacher, but also fulfills other requirements, including the following:

- Demonstrates the capacity to prepare students for STA/ISST membership in the tradition of Dora Kalff.
- Follows and upholds STA/ISST ethical guidelines, including the <u>STA Standards for</u> <u>Professional Conduct</u> and ISST <u>Code of Ethics</u> and <u>Rules of Procedure</u>.
- Teaches students to use the Jungian approach to sandplay.
- Demonstrates knowledge of the requirements and procedures that students must follow in order to become STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapists (CST).

The Certified Sandplay Therapist wishing to prepare for Teaching Member status must make arrangements with Teaching Members to fulfill the requirements below. Any costs that may be incurred are negotiated directly with the Teaching Members concerned.

## 1. Two (2) Years of CST Experience

**Requirement:** Have a minimum of 2 years of experience conducting full sandplay processes after STA/ISST certification.

**Rationale:** It is necessary to have further grounding in clinical practice after certification to deepen experience and understanding of the responsibilities of a Certified Sandplay Therapist.

**To document:** Teaching Member application is made after a minimum of 2 years of CST certification.

## 2. Conference Attendance and Presentation/Publication

Applicants for Teaching Member must attend an ISST congress or a national conference with international Teaching Members present, <u>and</u> complete one of the following:

- present a paper at the conference, or
- publish an article on sandplay therapy in a sandplay or other peer-reviewed journal.

**Rationale:** Attendance at international and national conference(s) with international presenters encourages a broader and deeper perspective. The capacity to present to one's peers and colleagues and defend a viewpoint is an important aspect of Teaching Member status.

**To document:** Include on application (Form CST-T-APP).

#### 3. Clinical Case Presentation

Prepare and present at least one clinical case in addition to the individual's final case for STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapist. This material may be presented at an STA or ISST conference, and/or used in co-teaching with a Teaching Member.

**Rationale:** Preparing teaching cases beyond the final case paper enriches a Teaching Member's clinical competencies and expands their teaching repertoire.

**To document:** Include on application (Form CST-T-APP).

## 4. Co-Teaching

Co-teach **two** (2) **sessions** with two different Teaching Members. This teaching should include not only the clinical case presentation, but also coaching of trainees for STA/ISST requirements (e.g., levels of membership, preparing and writing an initial paper or final case paper for STA/ISST certification). At least one of the co-teaching sessions must be at an introductory or fundamental level of sandplay therapy. A summary of written feedback (evaluations) from students is required for each co-teaching experience

**Rationale:** Co-teaching provides the opportunity to develop effective teaching skills and appropriate content, including knowledge of the Jungian theoretical base.

#### To document:

- Applicant includes course information on application (<u>Form CST-T-APP</u>).
- Co-teacher/Teaching Member completes a written critique (Form CST-T-COT)

- Applicant includes either copies of the evaluation forms (<u>CST-T-EVAL</u> or equivalent) completed by the students in attendance, or a copy of the Jotform course evaluation summary report generated by STA.
  - See the <u>STA Jotform Instructions</u> for the process of having students complete course evaluation forms online; doing so requires that the CST-T candidate complete the <u>Course Evaluation Form Pre-Fill</u> form in advance of the session, and receive a custom link from STA to provide to attendees.

## 5. Co-Facilitating

Co-facilitate with one or more STA/ISST Teaching Members for **two (2) case consultation group sessions**.

**Rationale:** Co-facilitating provides an opportunity to develop consultation content and style.

#### To document:

- Include dates of sessions on application (<u>Form CST-T-APP</u>).
- Teaching Member leading each group completes co-facilitator evaluation form (CST-T-COF).

### 6. Ethics and Procedures

Follow and uphold ethical guidelines and procedures, including the <u>STA Standards for Professional Conduct</u> and *STA Handbook*, and ISST <u>Code of Ethics</u> and <u>Rules of Procedure</u> and encourage prospective students to do the same.

**Rationale:** Such knowledge is important because Teaching Members have a responsibility to guide students through the process in an ethical and accurate manner. Moreover, Teaching Members can be approached by any potential student, including those from other countries, for advice or mentoring on working toward ISST certification.

**To document:** Attest on application (Form CST-T-APP).

## 4.2 Teaching Mentor

STA recommends that the prospective Teaching Member identify an STA/ISST Teaching Member of at least 2 years' standing to act as a mentor. The teaching mentor provides direction for the applicant in their preparation to become a Teaching Member.

## Chapter 5.

## **Advisor Information**

#### 5.1 When is an advisor needed?

- It is recommended that applicants for Registered Sandplay Practitioner (RSP) and Certified Sandplay Therapist (CST) choose an advisor early in their training process.
- An advisor is required at the time of the CST application.

## **5.2 Advisor Requirements**

- Certified Sandplay Therapist (CST) or Teaching Member.
- Knowledge of the STA/ISST guidelines and application process for RSP, CST, and Certified Teaching Membership (CST-T).
- Must not be applicant's personal process therapist.

#### 5.3 Role of the Advisor

- Checks in with advisee every 6 months to review progress.
- Reviews requirements and application procedure with applicant.
- Provides guidance on the choice of topic, structure, and requirements for the initial papers.
- Provides guidance on choice of case, structure, and requirements of final case paper.
- Assists with the selection of initial paper and final case readers.
- Acts as primary liaison between the applicant, STA, and final case readers.
- Reviews the application to make sure all requirements are met and documentation has been provided prior to submission.
- Maintains confidential records of correspondence during the advisory process, and, in case of non-acceptance, for five (5) years afterward.

#### 5.4 Applicant/Advisor Agreement

- Applicant and advisor co-sign the Applicant/Advisor agreement (<u>Form ADV</u>)
- Applicant pays advisor a one-time fee of \$100 when the agreement is signed.

- Importance of symbols and the symbolic language of the unconscious
- Introduction to exploration of symbols
- Stages and themes of the sandplay process
- Differentiation of Kalffian sandplay from other uses of sandplay and figures

#### A.2 Clinical Sandplay

Includes, but is not limited to:

- In-depth sandplay case study
- Co-transference

- Work with children and parents
- Work with adults
- Trauma and the neuroscience of sandplay
- Dimensions of diversity
- Termination
- Understanding sand trays
- Review of trays with client
- Expanded discussion of the unfolding sandplay process, including themes, transcendent function, relativization of the ego, tension of the opposites, manifestation of the Self
- Appearance of the body and psychosomatic themes
- Precautions, defenses, and resistances

## A.3 Jungian Theory

Includes, but is not limited to:

- Structure of the psyche: persona, ego, shadow, anima/animus, Self
- Nature of the unconscious and the relation between ego and unconscious
- Archetypes, symbols, and complexes
- Transference and countertransference
- Individuation process
- Psychic energy (the principles of equilibrium and constancy, progression and regression, integration of inner feminine and masculine)
- Extroversion and introversion (and typology)
- Transcendent function
- The living reality of the psyche

## A.4 Symbolism

Includes, but is not limited to:

- Religion
- Fairy tales
- Myths
- Cultural traditions

## Appendix B. Case Consultation

#### **B.1 General Information**

- "Consultation" for Certified Membership in STA/ISST is not the same as "supervision" required for graduate degrees and/or licensure.
- Case consultant must be an STA/ISST Teaching Member, someone other than the personal process therapist.
- To provide a variety of experiences and perspectives, case consultation hours must be accrued with a minimum of two (2) Teaching Members.
- Prior to engaging in individual or group consultation, the case consultant is required to meet the trainee (in-person or online) to become familiar with their clinical experience, credentials, approach to practice, and goals for consultation.
- Individual and group case consultation must be face-to-face and may take place in-person or online (e.g., Zoom).
- COVID-19 Exception Period: All eligible case consultation hours completed online between February 1, 2020 and December 31, 2023 are considered "in person" hours, and not subject to the online maximum.

## **B.2 Individual Consultation Requirements**

All individual case consultation may take place in person or online.

## **B.3 Group Consultation Requirements**

- Each group session is a **minimum of two (2) hours**, with one presenter per session.
- **In-person:** The preferred **maximum number** of participants for in-person group consultation is **six** (6), but may go up to a maximum of **ten** (10).
- Online<sup>8</sup>:
  - Maximum group size is **five** (5) **participants**.

- For those applying for RSP, all group consultation hours (up to 25 required for this level) may be completed online.
- For those applying for CST, a **maximum of 30 hours** of the 50 allowed for group consultation may be completed online (e.g., Zoom).
- For the depth of the online group learning experience, participants must remain with the same group and the same consultant until each member has presented **at least one time**.

## **B4. Summary of Consultation Hours Required**

## Appendix C. CST Initial Papers

#### C.1 Evaluation Criteria

Initial papers are read using the following criteria (see also the initial paper assessment form (CST-PAPER).

## 1. Knowledge of Theory as Relates to Symbols

The writer demonstrates use and knowledge of Jungian theory, the writings and theories of Margaret Lowenfield and Dora Kalff, as well as Buddhist or spiritual root of sandplay (i.e., Eastern/Western contemplative practices).

## 2. Personal Relationship to Symbol/Subject

The writer discusses their personal connection to the symbol/subject, including why they selected this symbol/subject, as well as how it is meaningful to them and how it has impacted their personal and/or professional life. The writer communicates a strong interest in the symbol/subject.

## 3. Amplification of Symbol/Subject

The writer amplifies the symbol/subject through discussion of theory, mythology, fairy tales, art, dreams, religion, and/or views from various cultures/collectives, including the writer's own culture. In a thoughtful, insightful, and competent manner, the writer surveys literature regarding the symbol/subject. The amplification catches the interest and imagination of the reader and indicates a deepening of understanding. The writer adds value to the discussion through providing their own reflections, including the transformative nature of the symbol/subject.

## 4. Impact of Symbol/Subject in Sandplay

The writer discusses the impact of the symbol/subject in sandplay, using hypothetical and/or actual sandplay scenes from their own experience. When discussing a symbol, the writer uses one (1) to three (3) photographs of sandplay scenes to competently describe how the symbol enhanced the therapeutic process of the sandplayer. When discussing a subject, the writer discusses how this information enhanced their knowledge about sandplay and how this knowledge might impact the sandplay process. The writer also indicates what types of investigation need to be done to further the understanding of the symbol/subject.

## 5. Mechanics of Symbol/Subject Paper

The writer submits a paper that meets professional standards. The paper is well written with a logical structure—that is, contains an introduction, middle, and conclusion. Care is given to writing mechanics, including correct spelling, sentence structure, and grammar. **The paper's format and references must follow APA standards.** Please refer to the latest edition of the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*.

## **C.2 The Reading Process**

- The applicant consults with their advisor and then contacts a Teaching Member who meets requirements (section C.3 below) to request that they be a reader.
- If the reader agrees to read the paper, the applicant completes the first section of the Initial Paper Assessment form (<u>CST-PAPER</u>) and uploads their paper PDF; the reader receives a notification and a link to download the file.
- For the second paper, the applicant also sends the reader a copy of the checklist/ assessment (<u>Form CST-PAPER</u>) from their first paper, as well as their advisory interview letter (<u>Form CST-INT</u>) to ensure that recommendations as to training and any earlier evaluation have been taken into account.
- The reader completes the online assessment form (<u>CST-PAPER</u>), including all four areas of criteria described above. Strengths and/or areas for improvement may be indicated in each area. Copies of the assessment are then forwarded to the applicant, advisor, and STA.
- If the paper has been evaluated to be insufficient, the reader provides suggestions for revision.
  - The applicant responds to the suggestions and submits a revised paper to the reader. If the revised paper is assessed as insufficient, the applicant may request another reader.
  - If the second reader also evaluates the paper as insufficient, a discussion takes place with the two readers and the advisor, and recommendations are made to the applicant.
  - If the applicant is dissatisfied with the final recommendations, an appeal can be made to the Exceptions Committee (see <u>Appendix F</u>).

## **C.3 Initial Paper Reader Requirements**

Each initial paper (e. g., symbol paper) must be approved by an STA/ISST Teaching Member in good standing, who is not the personal process therapist or advisor, and who does not have a close personal relationship with the applicant.

# Appendix D. CST Candidate Advisory Interview

## **D.1** Purpose

The purpose of the advisory interview is to provide helpful, constructive feedback to applicants in order to assist them in acquiring thorough, well-rounded, integrated training in sandplay, which will lead to successful completion of requirements for membership in STA/ISST.

#### **D.2 Procedure**

- 1. The applicant's initial paper (including evaluation results) and application are sent to the committee members for review prior to the interview.
- 2. The interview committee convenes a few minutes before the meeting to review the agenda and roles. The Chair assumes the role of greeting the applicant and explaining the procedure.
- 3. [30-45 minutes] The interview proceeds with the Chair taking the lead in facilitating questions and discussion. The Chair ensures that the applicant has an opportunity to ask any questions they may have.
- 4. [10-15 minutes] The Chair asks the applicant to wait outside the room while the committee discusses impressions and formulates recommendations.
- 5. [10-15 minutes] The applicant is invited back into the room for the sharing of feedback and recommendations. The Chair makes sure the applicant's strengths are noted in addition to areas that the committee feels need further development.
- 6. After the applicant leaves, the committee completes <u>Form CST-INT</u>, representing the committee's impressions, including a statement of thanks for the time and energy taken to attend the interview, comments on the applicant's strengths and aspects of training needing further development, and recommendations for addressing them. Copies are forwarded to STA, the applicant, and the advisor.
- 7. All electronic copies of materials should be deleted by committee members after completion of the interview process.

#### D.3 Criteria

The following criteria may be looked for in assessing an applicant undergoing an advisory interview:

- Indication that the applicant's connection to sandplay is a deep and personal one.
- Indication that the applicant is committed to ongoing personal growth and conveys an honest attitude of being in process—on a path, so to speak.
- Indication that the applicant understands the theory and process of sandplay and is able to
  articulate it in a clear, cohesive way. This should include a clear grasp of concepts of
  Jungian psychology and the ability to apply Jungian theory to the sandplay process. It
  should also include an ability to discriminate between Kalffian sandplay and other sand
  tray methods.
- Evidence that the applicant has met education and training requirements and training is proceeding toward a well-rounded, cohesive whole.
- Evidence that the applicant is practicing sandplay in a professional manner and respectful of "the free and protected space."

# Appendix E. CST Final Case Paper

#### **E.1** Preparing the Case Paper

The CST Candidate prepares an original case paper of a client who has gone through a sandplay process accompanied by the candidate. The case must be closed.

- The paper should include a cohesive presentation of the concluded sandplay process. The number of trays should be sufficient to show the development and transformation of the symbolic process.
- The writing should meet professional writing standards (e.g., APA format with proper spelling, grammar, citations, and references).
- The writing should demonstrate competence in the sandplay process and an understanding of theory, symbolic language, and co-transference.
- **Confidentiality** must be protected. A pseudonym is assigned to the client and all identifying information is removed or disguised.
- **Informed consent:** The candidate must declare that they have received a signed consent of the client (or parent/legal guardian if client is a minor) to use the client's material to write this case (<u>sample consent form</u>).
  - *Note*: Do <u>not</u> include a copy of the consent form with the case material, as this would violate confidentiality.
- Narrative: 30 to 50 pages of written text (excluding photos), using 12-point font and 1.5 line spacing (approximately 12,000 to 18,500 words). If the case has a large number of sand trays, the candidate discusses a selection of sand trays that can best illustrate the themes or progression of the case.
- **Photos** of each sandplay scene discussed may be embedded in the narrative.
  - Photos must be clear pictures of the whole tray, including boundaries of the tray, labeled with date and tray number.
  - Closeups may also be provided as needed.
  - Present photos of <u>all</u> trays done by the client (whether or not discussed) in a separate file.

#### **E.2 Structure and Content of the Paper**

*Introduction (1-2 pages)* 

- **Presentation of the setting:** number of sessions, number of sand trays and other general circumstances of the therapeutic process
- **Theoretical framework** and the therapist's approach to the work; description of the methods that are used in therapy
- Case background: personal and family history of the client
- **Detailed description** of the client's symptoms and diagnostic impressions
- Psychodynamic reflections about the client's situation, linking past history and current problems
- Describe the **client's goal and expectations** for therapy

Description of Each Sand Tray Selected for Discussion (in two parts)

- 1. Clear and concise description of the therapeutic session and process of construction of each sand tray (such as dry/wet sand, how the sand was manipulated, in which order the objects are used/placed in the sand, the relation of the objects to each other). Report the client's comments. Through this description—focused on what is relevant for the discussion—the reader should get a vivid impression of the whole scene and the creation process.
- 2. Analysis/interpretation of the sand tray based on the former description. Selected symbols should be interpreted in the context of the therapeutic situation and the particular case, using references to such things as alchemy, fairy tales, and mythology, clearly connected to the clinical material presented. Describe how the tray relates to the overall therapeutic journey. Kalffian and Jungian concepts should guide the interpretation, along with the therapist's theoretical framework.

#### Important Considerations

- Include **transference** and **countertransference** dynamics. Describe co-transference and how the "free and protected space" was maintained.
- **Integrate sandplay literature** and other theoretical sources in a consistent way.

• Link the therapeutic process to the actual life of the client and other data such as dreams, outer life, past experiences, family problems, and/or physical conditions.

#### Concluding the Paper

- **Summary:** Provide a 1- or 2-page summary at the end of the paper synthesizing the sandplay process, including its development and transformational elements. What happened in terms of psychodynamic evolution/psychological growth/individuation?
- **Bibliography** of sources that were cited throughout the text.

#### **E.3 Requesting Readers**

When the CST Candidate believes that their final case paper is ready for evaluation, they should first consult with their advisor, then proceed to contact **three** (3) <u>case readers on the approved list</u> (two from STA and one from another ISST society) using <u>Form CST-CRR</u>, the case reader request form.

- A reader must not have been the candidate's therapist, advisor, case consultant, or have had a prior personal relationship with the candidate.
- The candidate obtains a signed agreement from each reader.
- Normally, the final case is reviewed and evaluated within a 2-month period.
- If one or more readers are unable to meet the 2-month timeline, then other readers should be contacted.

#### E.4 What to Send

When the candidate sends their case reader request form, they simultaneously upload (a) a PDF of their final case paper, and (b) a PDF containing photos of <u>all</u> sand trays for the client, whether discussed in the paper or not. Applicants can provide links to Google Drive, Dropbox, etc., in lieu of uploading. Readers download the files via a link in the case reader request email; when a reader agrees to evaluate the candidate's paper, they also receive a link to complete the Final Case Evaluation form (CST-CASE).

A \$100 fee is due to each reader; the applicant can find the reader's preferred payment method on the signed Form CST-CRR.

#### **E.5 Final Case Evaluation**

A reader chooses to **accept**, **conditionally accept**, or **reject** a case paper (**Form CST-CASE**).

- **Acceptance:** the paper meets criteria
- Conditional acceptance: the reader has questions and requests clarification and/or revisions
- **Rejection:** the paper does not meet criteria and cannot be accepted by the reader, even in a revised form

After the candidate has submitted the final case paper to the readers, contact is made only through the candidate's advisor; the readers and candidate do not contact each other directly. Each reader's evaluation is communicated to the advisor, who summarizes findings and informs the candidate of the outcome of the evaluations; a copy of each evaluation is sent to STA upon submission by the reader.

### 1. Three (3) "Accept" Evaluations

Advisor informs the candidate that their case paper has been accepted by all 3 readers and shares the readers' evaluations with the candidate.

#### 2. Conditional Acceptance

If one or more readers evaluates the case with "conditional acceptance," a conference of the three readers is required to work toward a consensus as to what revisions, if any, will be asked of the candidate. Communication continues to flow through the advisor, and not directly with the candidate.

The candidate then makes the requested revisions and resubmits their paper to the same three readers. Once readers accept the revisions, they notify the advisor in writing, who notifies the candidate and STA Admissions Committee.

The advisor then shares the readers' evaluations with the candidate.

#### 3. Rejection

If one or more readers evaluates the case with a "rejection," the readers must arrange a conference. Upon conferring, readers may change their original evaluation findings and make suggestions for revisions.

The candidate then makes the requested revisions and resubmits their paper to the same

three readers. Once readers accept the revisions by consensus (or majority if they cannot come to a consensus) they notify the advisor in writing, who notifies the candidate and STA Admissions Committee.

The advisor then shares the readers' evaluations with the candidate.

If rejection is the final outcome, the candidate must prepare a different case for review. The candidate must wait at least one (1) year after receiving their evaluations before submitting the new case paper. For the new case paper, the process for choosing readers is the same as described above for the first final case paper, and the candidate may request different readers. If the applicant is dissatisfied with the final recommendations, an appeal can be made to the Exceptions Committee (see <u>Appendix F</u>).

### **E.6 Final Case Reader Qualifications**<sup>9</sup>

- Case readers must be a Teaching Member (CST-T) for a minimum of two (2) years.
- Potential case reader must mentor with two different ISST-approved case readers on two
   (2) or more cases in total. Mentoring process cannot begin until mentee has achieved Teaching Member status.
- When the mentee has completed the mentoring process with demonstrated competence, the trainee initiates <a href="Form CR-QUAL">Form CR-QUAL</a>, which is forwarded to the mentor for their evaluation. When forms are received from both mentors and reviewed by the Admissions Committee, the teaching member is added to the STA final case reader list.
- In order to be sensitive to global differences, those teaching members who wish to read
  papers from other countries are encouraged to mentor with an international reader from
  another society or on a case from another society.

#### Section 2.1, Post-Graduate Degree and Clinical Knowledge Base

New sections, added to make clear the existing requirements as set in the 2018 STA Bylaws.

#### Section 2.1, STA Associate Membership

New:

**Requirement:** Those applying for RSP certification are required to be STA Associate members. **Rationale:** To develop resources, to access the *Journal of Sandplay Therapy*®, and to build a supportive community of practice, all persons interested in sandplay therapy are encouraged to become Associate members of STA. For those pursuing credentialing in sandplay, Associate membership is recommended early in the training process.

#### Section 2.2, Personal Sandplay Process

Old:

**Rationale:** Dora Kalff states, "The emphasis of the sandplay process is on the fullness or wholeness of the process." As we are often asked for guidance and clarification, it seems helpful to provide our minimum expectations.

New:

**Rationale:** Engaging fully in a personal sandplay process provides an essential foundation for sandplay practice. Dora Kalff asserts that to accompany others in sandplay therapy—a journey into the unconscious—it is necessary to have a deep, personal experience doing one's own sandplay process.

Frau Kalff emphasizes two "all-important" prerequisite competencies for sandplay practice that are rooted in personal process: (1) Profound knowledge of symbolic language that comes from one's own psychic experience, and (2) Being capable of holding the "free and protected space" for others by developing awareness of one's own dark or unknown sides as well as one's own deep-seated positive potential.

### Section 2.2, Sandplay Education and Training

Old:

Twelve of the 36 hours may be earned through STA approved on-line courses.

New:

- A maximum of 20 of the 36 hours may be earned through online courses that meet requirements for STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Training.
  - Live, interactive webinars are intended as the primary means to acquire online education and training hours.
  - o A maximum of 12 of the online hours may be asynchronous (self-study), provided

the course meets STA requirements and is approved for university credit or CEs from a professional organization (such as APA, NASW, or ACA) and includes a post-test.

New:

**Rationale:** Obtaining practical and theoretical knowledge as outlined in the Sandplay Training Curriculum Guide (<u>Appendix A</u>), along with participating in experiential learning opportunities, provide a necessary foundation for developing competency in sandplay practice.

#### Section 2.2, Case Consultation

New:

**Rationale:** The purpose of consultation is to facilitate the exploration and enhancement of one's own clinical work.

#### Section 2.3, Letters of Recommendation

Old:

Letters of recommendation from two STA certified members who are familiar with the applicant and his/her work.

New:

RSP applicants are required to have two (2) letters of recommendation from STA colleagues who are familiar with the applicant and their work. One or both letters can be submitted by STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapists or Teaching Members; one letter may be from a Registered Sandplay Practitioner.<sup>10</sup>

New:

**Rationale:** Letters of recommendation provide endorsement from colleagues who know the applicant.

#### Section 2.4, RSP Application

Addition of attestation of ethical standards.

#### **Chapter 3: Certified Sandplay Therapist (CST)**

Addition of introductory material describing the overall process of becoming a Certified Sandplay Therapist.

#### Section 3.1, Post-Graduate Degree

Old:

**Time Frame:** Two years prior to application.

New:

**Timing:** [No longer specified]

#### Section 3.1, Clinical Knowledge Base

Old:

**Requirement:** Knowledge of psychotherapy, psycho-diagnosis, and psychology obtained through formal study and two years of supervised certified experience.

New:

**Requirement:** Knowledge of psychotherapy, psychopathology and diagnosis, and psychology obtained through formal study and supervised internship experience.

#### Section 3.1, Licensure

Old:

**Requirement:** License in a mental health or related field.

**To Document:** Submit a photocopy of license with application. Also submit evidence of having completed 2000 hours of direct supervised counseling and/or psychotherapy experience. If licensure is not required in your state, submit information substantiating this with your application. Please include a description of your scope of practice.

New:

**Requirement:** License in a mental health field.

**To document:** Upload a copy of license to **Form E&T**.

#### Section 3.1, STA Associate Membership

New rationale, as described above for Section 2.1.

#### Section 3.1, Personal Development for CST

Old:

**Requirement:** In-depth inner development and insight as gained through analysis and/or psychotherapy.

New:

**Requirement:** In-depth inner development such as Jungian analysis, personal psychotherapy, or other intensive psychological work.

#### Section 3.2, Personal Sandplay Process

Updated rationale, as described above for Section 2.2.

#### Section 3.2, Advisor

Old:

**Requirement:** To become a candidate for membership, an applicant must choose an STA member as an advisor. The advisor must have held certified membership in ISST for at least two years prior to selection as an advisor, and may not have served as the applicant's therapist.

New:

**Requirement:** To apply for Certified Membership, an applicant must choose an advisor who is an STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Therapist or Teaching Member and who is not the applicant's personal process therapist."

#### Section 3.2, Sandplay Education and Training for CST

Old:

[ISST requirement] We allow a maximum of 20 hours theoretical online learning.

#### New12:

- A **maximum of 70 of the 120 hours** may be earned through online courses that meet requirements for STA/ISST Certified Sandplay Training.

  - A maximum of 12 of the online hours may be asynchronous (self-study), provided the
    course meets STA requirements and is approved for university credit or CEs from a
    professional organization (such as APA, NASW, or ACA) and includes a post-test.

New rationale, as described above for Section 2.2.

#### Section 3.2, Case Consultation

Old:

**Time Frame:** It is recommended that consultation be delayed until after the applicant's personal sandplay process is complete or at least meaningfully underway.

**To Document:** A letter (or signature) from the applicant's primary consultant verifying the applicant's total number of consultation hours accrued with all consultants must be submitted with the application.

#### New:

**Timing:** It is recommended that consultation be delayed until after the applicant's personal sandplay process is complete or at least meaningfully underway. It is also recommended that trainees are working with at least three (3) clients per week who have engaged with sandplay on a regular basis for a significant period of time (i.e., at least 9 to 12 months).

**To document:** List consultation sessions (date, consultant name, session format, hours, and [for group sessions] hours presenting) on Form E&T and upload either completion certificate or letter from each consultant verifying hours.

#### Section 3.2, Initial Papers

Change in terminology from "preliminary paper" to "initial paper."

#### Section 3.2, Initial Paper Readers

It was determined that Teaching Members are competent to read initial papers without additional training. This change also expands the number of people available to read papers.

#### Old:

[Requirements to be a Preliminary Paper Reader:]

- 1. Must be a teaching member of STA.
- 2. Must be a member in good standing.
- 3. Must not have a dual role with the applicant.
- 4. Must have completed preliminary paper reading training.

#### New13:

**Approval:** Each initial paper must be approved by an STA/ISST Teaching Member in good standing, who is not the personal process therapist or advisor, and who does not have a close personal relationship with the applicant (see <u>Appendix C</u> for detailed paper guidelines).

#### Section 3.2, Advisory Interview

Old:

**Requirement:** Once submitted, the application will be reviewed by the Admissions Chair. The applicant will then be scheduled for an interview with an Advisory Committee appointed by the Admissions Committee. The committee will make a recommendation after the interview to the Admissions Chair regarding the readiness of the applicant to become a candidate.

#### New:

**Requirement:** Once the application is reviewed by the Admissions Committee, the applicant is scheduled for an interview with an Advisory Committee, who meets with the applicant, summarizes the applicant's strengths, and makes suggestions for ongoing development. See Appendix D for more information.

#### Section 3.2, Final Case Paper

Old:

- 1. Submit a report of no more than 40 pages of written text
- 2. Affix prints of each sandplay scene (labeled with date and tray number) to the relevant text, in each copy of the report.

#### New:

- Narrative: 30 to 50 pages of written text (excluding photos), using 12-point font and 1.5 line spacing (approximately 12,000 to 18,500 words). If the case has a large number of sand trays, the candidate discusses a selection of sand trays that can best illustrate the themes or progression of the case.
- Photos of each sandplay scene discussed may be embedded in the narrative.
  - Photos must be clear pictures of the whole tray, including boundaries of the tray, labeled with date and tray number.
  - Closeups may also be provided as needed.
  - Present photos of all trays done by the client (whether or not discussed) in a separate file.

#### Section 3.4, CST Application

Addition of attestation of ethical standards and ethics history questions.

#### Chapter 4: Certified Sandplay Therapist - Teacher (CST-T)

#### Section 4.1, Clinical Case Presentation

New:

**Rationale:** Preparing teaching cases beyond the final case paper enriches a Teaching Member's clinical competencies and expands their teaching repertoire.

#### Section 4.1, Ethics and Procedures

Old:

**Rationale:** Such knowledge is important because Teaching Members can be approached by any potential students, including those from countries without National ISST Society, for advice or mentoring on working towards ISST Certification.

New:

**Rationale:** Such knowledge is important because Teaching Members have a responsibility to guide students through the process in an ethical and accurate manner. Moreover, Teaching Members can be approached by any potential student, including those from other countries for advice or mentoring on working toward ISST certification.

#### Section 4.2, Teaching Mentor

Change in terminology from "teaching consultant" to "teaching mentor."

Old:

The consultant will also collate documentation and when all requirements are met satisfactorily will propose the applicant and forward documentation to the STA admissions chair. The chair will save the application in the member's file and forward to the ISST certification committee. The teaching consultant will not necessarily fulfill the evaluation of all items 1-7 as these may be conducted by various Teaching Members.

New:

[No longer specified; applicant is responsible for submitting documents]

#### **Chapter 5: Advisor**

#### Section 5.3, Role of the Advisor

Old:

When candidate submits second paper to reader, send the first preliminary paper evaluation and the advisory interview letter to the second reader. This is to ensure that recommendations as to training and any earlier evaluation is taken into account before the final paper is written.

New:

#### **Appendix B: Case Consultation**

#### Section B.1, General Information

[Stipulates that a consultant may establish a relationship with a group member, among other options, by meeting with them in individually and by obtaining the group member's CV with information about professional background, experience, sandplay training, etc.]

#### New:

- For those applying for CST, a **maximum of 30 hours** of the 50 allowed for group consultation may be conducted online (e.g., Zoom).
- For the depth of the online group learning experience, participants must remain with the same group and the same consultant until each member has presented at least one time.

New section, added for completeness and clarity.

#### **Appendix C: CST Initial Papers**

#### Section C.2, Reading Process

Procedure clarification:

For the second paper, the applicant also sends the reader a copy of the checklist/ assessment (Form CST-PAPER) from their first paper, as well as their advisory interview letter (Form CST-INT) to ensure that recommendations as to training and any earlier evaluation have been taken into account.

# Section C.2, Reading Process, insufficient rating

Old:

If the paper has been evaluated to be insufficient, the reader is asked to suggest corrective action for the applicant to take. The applicant can respond to the suggestions or find another reader. If the second reader also evaluates the paper as insufficient, a discussion will take place with the two readers and the advisor and recommendations will be made to the applicant. If the applicant is dissatisfied with the final recommendations, an appeal can be made to the Exceptions Committee.

#### New:

- If the paper has been evaluated to be insufficient, the reader provides suggestions for revision.
  - The applicant responds to the suggestions and submits revised paper to the reader. If the revised paper is assessed as insufficient, the applicant may request another reader.
  - If the second reader also evaluates the paper as insufficient, a discussion will take place with the two readers and the advisor, and recommendations will be made to the applicant.
  - If the applicant is dissatisfied with the final recommendations, an appeal can be made to the Exceptions Committee (see <u>Appendix F</u>).

### Section C.3, Initial Paper Reader Requirements

See above, Chapter 3, section 3.2.

#### **Appendix E: Final Case Paper**

#### Section E.1, Preparing the Case Paper

New section.

#### Old:

4. include a copy of the STA Permission Grant (Form 7), completed by the client or parent of each case report. The original form should be retained in the candidate's files.

#### New:

- **Informed consent:** The candidate must declare that they have received a signed consent of the client (or parent/legal guardian if client is a minor) to use the client's material to write this case (sample consent form).
  - Note: Do <u>not</u> include a copy of the consent form with the case material, as this would violate confidentiality.

#### Section E.2, Structure and Content of the Paper

New section.

#### Section E.4, What to Send

Old:

In sending the final case report to each reader, the candidate should:

- 1. include a self-addressed, stamped post card to acknowledge receipt of the final case study.
- 2. enclose a check for \$100.00 made payable to the reader. The international reader should be asked how he/she would like to be paid.
- 3. include a copy of the "Final Case Report Reader Assessment" form (Form 9). The candidate should complete the top part of this form.
- 4. enclose a large self-addressed, stamped envelope, if the candidate wishes his/ her final case report to be returned.

#### New:

When the candidate sends their case reader request form, they simultaneously upload (a) a PDF of their final case paper, and (b) a PDF containing photos of <u>all</u> sand trays for the client, whether discussed in the paper or not. Applicants can provide links to Google Drive, Dropbox, etc., in lieu of uploading. Readers download the files via a link in the case reader request email; when a reader agrees to evaluate the candidate's paper, they also receive a link to complete the Final Case Evaluation form (<u>CST-CASE</u>).

A \$100 fee is due to each reader; the applicant can find the reader's preferred payment method on the signed <u>Form CST-CRR</u>.

#### Section E.5, Final Case Evaluation

Language was simplified for clarification purposes; it is recommended that Final Case Readers, CST Candidates, and advisors review this section in detail and familiarize themselves with the procedure as described.

#### Section E.6, Final Case Reader Qualifications

Old:

- 1. Ten years as a CST member, with a minimum of 8 years as a Teaching Member. Mentoring to become a final case reader can begin after being a teaching member for eight years.
- 2. Mentoring by one case reader.
- 3. Four final case reports will be read with the mentor.
- 4. Mentor shall notify the Admissions Chair when member has completed above requirements and is eligible to be a final case reader.

New16:

- Case readers must be a Teaching Member (CST-T) for a minimum of two (2) years.
- Potential case reader must mentor with two different ISST-approved case readers on two (2)
  or more cases in total. Mentoring process cannot begin until mentee has achieved Teaching
  Member status.
- When the mentee has completed the mentoring process with demonstrated competence, the mentor completes <u>Form CR-QUAL</u>. When forms are received from both mentors and reviewed by the Admissions Committee, the teaching member is added to the <u>STA final</u> <u>case reader list</u>.
- In order to be sensitive to global differences, those teaching members who wish to read
  papers from other countries are encouraged to mentor with an international reader from
  another society or on a case from another society.
