Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Meet the needs of all children
- 2. Develop and utilize lesson plans, which reflect mandated elements, parental and cultural influences, and promote the social, emotional, physical, and cognitive development of the children.
- 3. Individualize one-to-one and group activities to reflect the unique needs and strengths of all children in the classroom.
- 4. Follow a consistent schedule, which includes small and large group experiences, choice time, music and movement, large and small motor activities, skill development, meals, and effective transitions between activities.
- 5. Encourage experimentation, exploration, problem solving, cooperation, socialization, and choice-making; ask open-ended questions and listen respectfully to the answers.
- 6. Provide an atmosphere that promotes and reinforces parental involvement in the classroom.
- 7. Supervise and monitor children at all times.
- 8. Respond to crisis or emergency situations that may occur. Provide first aid or CPR, prevent the spread of blood borne pathogens, and access emergency services.

Written Documentation

- Maintain accurate written records, including assessments, parent/teacher conference and other required forms.
- 2. Participate in regularly scheduled team meetings to plan for and deliver collaborative services across all components.
- 3. Plan and conduct regular parent meetings with team members.
- 4. Complete two parent/teacher conferences yearly.

Attributes

- 1. Assess individual and group needs, attending to special needs, specific interests, strengths and concerns.
- 2. With parental involvement, develop balanced lesson plans, which are developmentally appropriate, intellectually challenging and address each child's strengths and needs.
- 3. Establish daily and weekly goals, which will promote educational plans.
- 4. Prepare classroom materials to support lesson plans; change and create learning centers as needed.
- 5. Adapt curriculum to address and meet individual goals for children as identified in their individualized education plans.

Miscellaneous

- 1. Attend meetings, trainings, and appropriate professional development activities.
- 2. Assure general maintenance and security of the facility.
- 3. Assist in inventory of all site equipment.
- 4. Other duties as requested.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- 1. Strong knowledge of human development, family dynamics, and needs of children:
- 2. Teacher qualifications according to DHS. A teacher must be at least 18 years of age and meet the qualifications of the state.
- 3. Ability to apply Early Childhood Development theory in daily classroom activities and adapt to the individual needs of children.
- 4. Excellent communications skills, especially good listening skills.
- 5. Working knowledge of available community resources.
- 6. Employment is conditional pending Background Verification.
- 7. Ability to regularly lift up to 40 pounds during the workday.
