Sun, June 29 Bethlehem: City of David and City of Jesus' Birth (Adult Formation), 9:15 a.m. In this one-Sunday session The Rev. Canon Mary June Nestler will guide our look at the biblical, historical, and archaeological traditions that made this out-of-the-way village a household name even in our day. Come learn about the earliest writings that describe where Jesus was born, how Emperor Constantine the Great adorned the site, and how local Christians host the pilgrims of the world all year round. This class is suitable for people aged 16 and up.

After Nicea; More Councils and the Formation of Christian Belief (Adult Formation) July 13 and 20: Join The Rev. Cn. Mary June Nestler in this follow-on series of two sessions that will explore the aftermath of the Council of Nicea in 325 CE. Nicea was the first of many so-called "ecumenical councils," gatherings of the bishops of the Mediterranean world to formulate standard Christian belief. In this two-session class we will explore what happened after the original Nicene Creed was promulgated, and why Christians had divisions about various doctrines. We'll relate these questions to our modern Episcopal Church and its theologies of God, Christ, and Holy Spirit.

Young Adult Camping Trip, July 18-20: St. Mark's young adults (16-35) are going camping in July! Join us for two nights of fun, food, fellowship, and time spent in God's creation. We'll be heading just over an hour away to the beautiful Stansbury mountains.
