# PROCESS:

# **Community Code Contributions**

This document is intended to outline a new process for end-to-end management of code contributions from the Mycroft Community.

#### Aims:

- Provide an efficient process for all code contributions to the Mycroft project.
- Establish clear expectations on both the project and contributors.
- Encourage broader participation in the project.

# **Principles**

- 1. All contributions should be reviewed.
- 2. Feedback provided should be constructive, respectful and made in good faith.
- 3. Where it is unclear, feedback received should be considered to be made as above.
- 4. Automate everything we can let the tools and tests take the first rounds of the process.

# **Process Overview**

- 1. Bug Report created or Feature proposed
- 2. Code contributor reviews How to Contribute Guide
- 3. Pull Request made by code contributor
- 4. Cl processes
  - a. Pylint
  - b. Voight Kampff tests
  - c. PR Labelling
- 5. Initial PR review

Additional labels are applied, and if appropriate a comment is added to indicate what steps are required to progress toward a merge (up to 5 business days)

6. Human review

PR's will be reviewed as team members or contributors are able to do so.

# Types of Changes

All code changes fall into one of five main categories:

- 1. Bug Fixes (including documentation changes)
  - a. Quick
  - b. Complex
- 2. Code improvements including refactors, adding documentation or tests.
- 3. Features
  - a. Roadmapped
  - b. Proposal / request

Reviewing and merging pull requests should also be prioritized in this order. As such feature requests that have broad Community support will be prioritized over those coming out of the blue.

## **Bug Report**

Bug Reports are to be filed as issues on the relevant Github repository, or made as a new post in the <u>Community Forums Support category</u>.

Minimum information required:

- Platform [Mark 1, Mark II, Picroft, Linux, Docker, Other]
  - o If Linux:
  - Operating System:
  - o Installation method [git clone, Snap, package manager, other]
- Issue details

Including an outline of problem and steps required to recreate the problem.

Supporting information

May include: log files, screenshots, link generated by Support Skill, etc.

### Feature Proposal

# Pull Request

Required information in a pull request (aka PR template)

### **Automatic Triggers**

#### Abandonment

If an author has not responded to a comment within two weeks the PR will be automatically closed. The author may reopen the pull request when they are ready to proceed. However if it is reopened with no new information then it can be immediately closed again.

# Labeling

#### Important Notes:

- Terms such as quick and complex are not representative of the work or thought that went into a pull request. We all know that some of the best coding requires changing few characters after significant thought and work.
- It is impossible to outline a set of criteria that fits every situation. Where possible examples are given to provide a guide, but it is expected that individual judgement and discretion will be used.

The color of labels may provide a quick indication as to the broad meaning of a label and the actions required:

Blue (#22a7f0) = Informative label only.

Green (#0e8a16) = On track. Ready for progress by any contributor.

Yellow (#fbca04) = Action required. Input from author or other contributor familiar with the PR is likely required.

Purple (#5319e7) = Team action required. A member of the Community or internal teams likely needed to progress.

Orange (#ff9900) = PR is being intentionally held for some reason.

Red (#b60205) = PR closed. No further action will be taken.

| Type: Bug -<br>quick               | Bug fixes that are quick to review and the implications of the change are clear and contained. Eg typo's, error handling, etc.                                |       |

| Merge after next release             | PR should not be merged until after the next release.  |  |
| Breaking change                      | PR contains breaking changes and should not be merged until the next major release is being prepared.  |  |
| Status: Not accepted                 | PR will not be accepted by the project. Clear feedback should be provided as to why it was not accepted and how the author might modify or improve it.         |  |

### Human review

### Bug fix

- 1. Confirm bug exists
- 2. Perform code review
- 3. Confirm bug is fixed when change is applied
- 4. If changes are minimal merge once approved
- 5. If changes are complex request code review from other senior members

### Feature - Proposal

1. Not ready for review - see Feature Proposal process.

# Feature - Roadmapped

- 1. Confirm feature has been approved for the roadmap
- 2. Perform code review
- 3. If you do not have permission to merge or the change is significant and would benefit from an extra set of eyes, request an additional review.

# All cases - before merge

- 1. Confirm new test coverage is appropriate
- 2. Confirm documentation exists and has been updated to reflect the changes. *This includes documentation in the code and mycroft.ai/documentation*
- 3. Confirm "CLA: Yes" label added by mycroft-devs bot
- 4. Confirm PR is being merged to the correct branch Either "dev" or the latest core version for Skills eg "20.08"
- 5. Review list of commits squash commits on merge if needed
