	Nevada County Workforce Profile Stephanie Ortiz • NCW Profile PP (Stephanie): Report was finished in March just prior to COVID. Authored by Center's of Excellence. 8 economic sectors for workforce development were identified as priority areas; health care, construction, manufacturing, utilities, professional, scientific, and technical services, information, accommodation and food service, and Arts, Entertainment, and Rec. Less than 1 out of 10 CTE degrees/certs go to Nevada County residents. Less than ½ of employers employ 35% of the workforce. Wages are lower than in other parts of the state. Maintenance and management are areas for growth. The report indicated many industries are in decline and jobs may result from retirement and separation.
	Aurora Thompson NU Ag Nat Resources: New Ag Business pathway now includes two ways to become a completer and adds Ag GFSF and floral classes, which include Adv. Floral as a new capstone New capstone "Greenhouse and Nursery Management" for Ornamental Horticulture pathway New Ag Mech teacher Kassidy D'Andrade NU Arts. Media, Entertainment: DCA "Academies" TV Broadcast pathway has come to an end. Video Production still exists and is a course any NU student can continue to take New to NU Visual and Commercial Arts pathway, which affords students an opportunity to become a completer with either "Online Multimedia" or "Publication Design", aligned with BR's sequence. NU Transportation (auto) has moved to a 3-course sequence, as opposed to a block course for capstone students, this has increased enrollment. NU Sports Medicine has also moved to a 3-course sequence, as opposed to a block course for capstone students, this has increased enrollment. NU Manufacturing emerging as a more robust pathway, folding in the previous woodworking course, under this umbrella. BR Stage Technology (tech theatre) has increased offerings with an addition of "Special Effects/Rigging" BR Ag Nat Resources Andy Barhydt, formerly at NU has transferred to BR as the Ag Mech teacher



• NJUHSD Building Construction Trades - new course offering this year with the introductory course "Residential and Commercial Construction" located at Park Ave in Grass Valley and co-located with Silver Springs HS. New instructor, Eli Ferrier

CTE Facilities & Grant Updates

Jordan Kohler/Aurora Thompson

- CTE Facilities Project Updates (Jordan): BR and NU ag are well under construction and projects are running smoothly. Both had unforeseen conditions, but the intention is to have both buildings online by Oct. break. Structural reviews were needed for BR's site. NU parking lot construction is related to ADA access for the NU ag building. The culinary project is currently at DSA and internal demo is occurring. This will be a lease, leaseback. SS shop has been demoed and just made it out of DSA last week so construction can start. Should be in the Oct or Nov board packet.
- CTE Facilities Project Grant Update (Aurora): Applications for NU Culinary Modernization in the amount of \$1,163,704, NU Ag Modernization \$1,500,000, Park Ave Construction Trades \$1,182,647 were submitted last November, all of which received high passing scores ranging from ranking 7th -16th in the state out of 187 other passing applications. All three applications have moved through the next process which requires responses to both 15-day and 4-day letters from the Office of Public School Construction, in which the district successfully provided all requested information. The next step is for the OPSC to present the list of CTE projects to the State Allocation Board (SAB). It is anticipated the item will go to the September 30th SAB meeting for approval.
 - Mike Hauser asked if CTE teachers need any support in creating DL grab bags. Ms. Thompson responded that she would start a CTE wish list to go out to CTE teachers for this purpose.

Internships/WBL

• Internships/WBL Opportunites for 2020-21 (Kelsey/Christina): Christina has been working career cohorts as related to senior projects. The new structure will have students select a CTE area of interest and then engage in meetings with a mentor in the industry sector and then later provide a related project (15-hour min) to fulfill the project requirements. Mentors will use a rubric to grade the outcome project and this information will be used to support the students' final senior project grade. Kelsey shared out the CTE Community Industry Cohorts Master List. Identifies industry partners and in what capacity those partners are willing to participate. All in-person internships will follow strict protocols related to health and safety during the COVID pandemic. Ms. Thompson is currently working with the District's insurance provider and legal, to draft a set of protocols in anticipation of in-person internships.

Comments: Aurora provided an overview of the history of Perkins V funding and the new requirements. A presentation to review NJUHSD's performance and responses related to the 7



questions was provided: Stakeholder consultation and engagement, Student performance on required performance, Program size, scope, and quality to meet the needs of all students, Progress toward implementation of CTE programs of study, Improving recruitment, retention, and training of CTE professionals, including underrepresented groups, Progress towards equal access to CTE programs for all students, and Alignment to Labor Market Information (LMI). As an outcome of the information shared the District Advisory committee recommended that future focus on a PR campaign to celebrate the graduation rates and other highlights of the CTE program completers would be beneficial. It was mentioned that community members outside of NCCA were unaware of the new building construction trades program. Ms. Thompson acknowledged this need and under the new CLNA, this would be prioritized. The committee took a vote on the approval of the CLNA.
