

IMPORTANT DATES + REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- What are the Important Dates?
 - Monday, February 26th: <u>Registration Opens at 8PM!</u>
 - Monday, February 26th: Scholarship applications open. <u>Apply for scholarship here!</u>
 - Applying for scholarship counts as your convention registration, you do not need to register separately.
 - Monday, March 11th: Scholarship applications due by 11:59pm.
 - Wednesday, March 13th: Scholarship awards announced.
 - Friday, March 15th: Registration closes at 5:00pm. <u>No refunds can be given after this</u> <u>date.</u>
 - Friday, April 12th: Council Convention begins!
 - Buses will leave at approximately 3:45 pm. Exact timing will be sent out closer to convention
 - **Sunday, April 14th:** Council Convention concludes.
 - Pickup will be approximately 1:30pm

How much does Council Convention cost?

- Council Convention costs \$350 and includes the following:
 - Roundtrip bus transportation between Fairfax and camp
 - Five meals and many snacks
 - Lodging
 - Program supplies and swag
 - Guest speakers and educators
 - And surprises along the way!
- Scholarship is available and we encourage you to apply. There is an opportunity to list why you are applying for a scholarship (teen paying for convention, family expenses, etc.) that may paint a bigger picture than your AGI. <u>Please apply here!</u>
 - Scholarship applications are due by Monday, March 11th at 11:59pm. Applying for a scholarship confirms your registration. Scholarship awards will be announced by Wednesday, March 13th.
 - We strongly hope that finances will not be a barrier to any teen attending the convention. Please <u>reach out to Hannah Feldman</u> if you'd like to discuss further.



• What is the cancellation/refund policy?

- The deadline to cancel with a full program refund is the final registration deadline, Friday, March 15.
- Until that date, full refunds will be granted for cancellations in writing (email is acceptable) for any reason.
 - After the registration deadline we've already confirmed final counts with our vendors, and no refunds can be given for any reason. "No shows" will not receive a refund.
- How many teens will be at Council Convention?
 - We plan to have about 80-100 teens at Council Convention!

• What if someone needs to arrive late or leave early?

- We understand that members have other activities and commitments throughout the weekend. We will allow participants to arrive late or leave the convention early.
 - We are not able to offer any prorated rates if a participant must miss parts of the convention.

- Council Convention is for ALL teens in Baltimore Council BBYO! Whether you have just joined or you are a graduating senior, we would love to have you there! No leadership role of prior program participation is required.

- We welcome all Jewish teens in the Baltimore area in grades 8-12 who are registered members of BBYO.

• What are the accommodations?

- Teens will be staying in camp-style cabins with 12-15 participants
- There are bathrooms and showers in the cabins
- Alephs will be in cabins with Alephs, and BBGs will be in cabins with BBGs
- Is the food Kosher?
 - While camp does not have a Glatt Kosher kitchen, all food served will be kosher-style. We will not mix dairy and meat, and any meat served will be kosher.
- Is the food nut-free?
 - Yes! BBYO has a strict nut-free policy at conventions. All food served will be nut-free and teens may not bring any snacks containing nuts.
