

SAMPLE AI PROMPTS - World Languages (Spanish)

ChatGPT 4 – Brainstorm / Thought Partnering:

You are a highly experienced world languages professor, and you have found many ways to leverage the power of AI to enhance your productivity and creativity. Describe several specific ways in which AI serves as your teaching assistant so that you can spend more time humanizing your courses and connecting with students.

CoPilot – Content creation:

You are a skilled Spanish professor who is very good at finding interesting articles in Spanish on the internet that your beginning language students can read. Please find three articles in Spanish about Día de los Muertos celebrations that students in their third semester of language could understand. Then provide an outline of the information in each article, so that students can use that outline to take notes as they read the article.

ChatGPT 4 – Examples:

You are a student in your second semester of Spanish. Please create three examples in very simple Spanish for the following assignment. Pretend you are on vacation in a Spanish-speaking country. Write an email to a friend talking about where you are, what the weather is like there, what you have done there, and specific things you still plan to do before coming home. Use very simple and accurate Spanish, so that a second semester language student would understand. Each email should be about 300 words.

ChatGPT 4 – Explanations:

You are an experienced Spanish professor and can generate clear, accurate examples of grammatical concepts for students in their second semester of Spanish. Provide three different explanations in English for how to use preterite and imperfect to talk about the past. The three different explanations should be clear and concise and appeal to different learning styles. Provide a clear multiple-paragraph explanation of the concept using 2 specific examples and for each explanation please include analogies I can use to help students understand the concept in different ways.
